## Bike shop wheels along

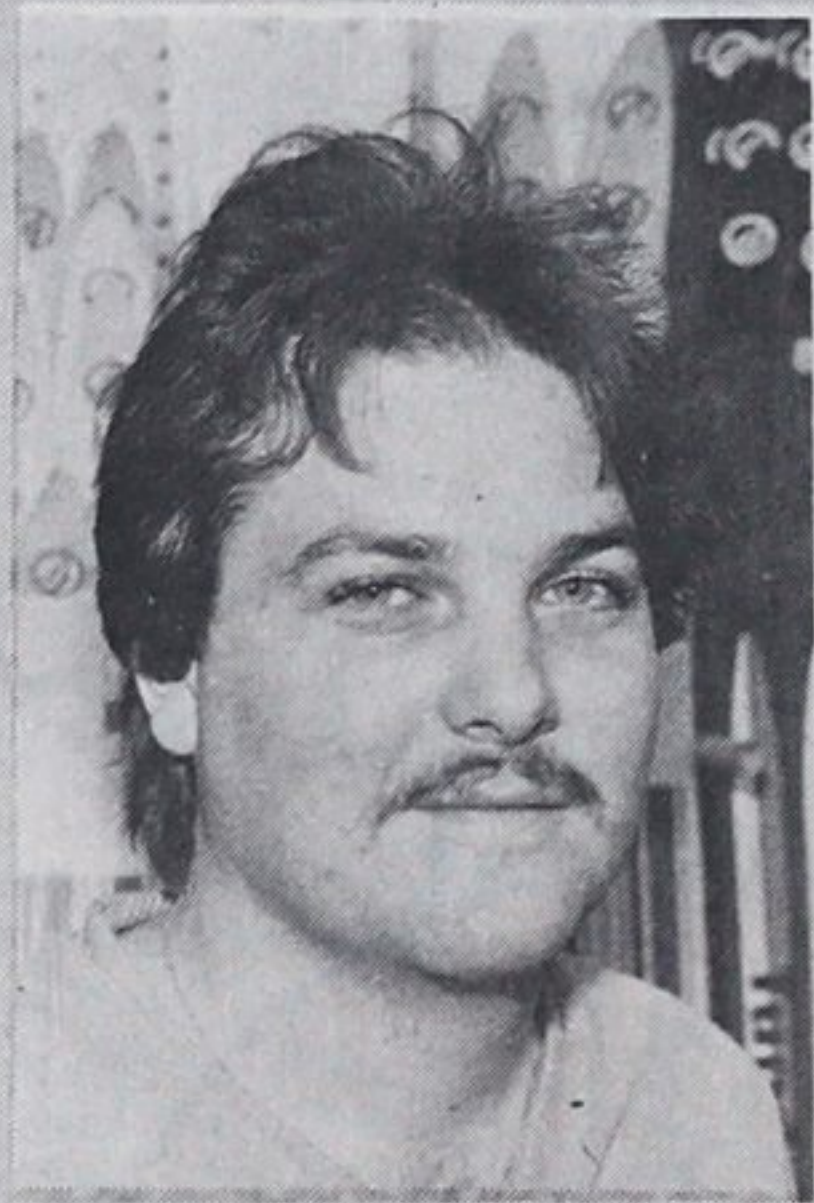
Bike Shop squeezed out IUE in Midland minor Hockey Association Novice House League action Saturday in Midland Centennial Arena by a score of 5-4.
