Radio Telemetry Hikes - Raccoons fitted with radio-transmitting

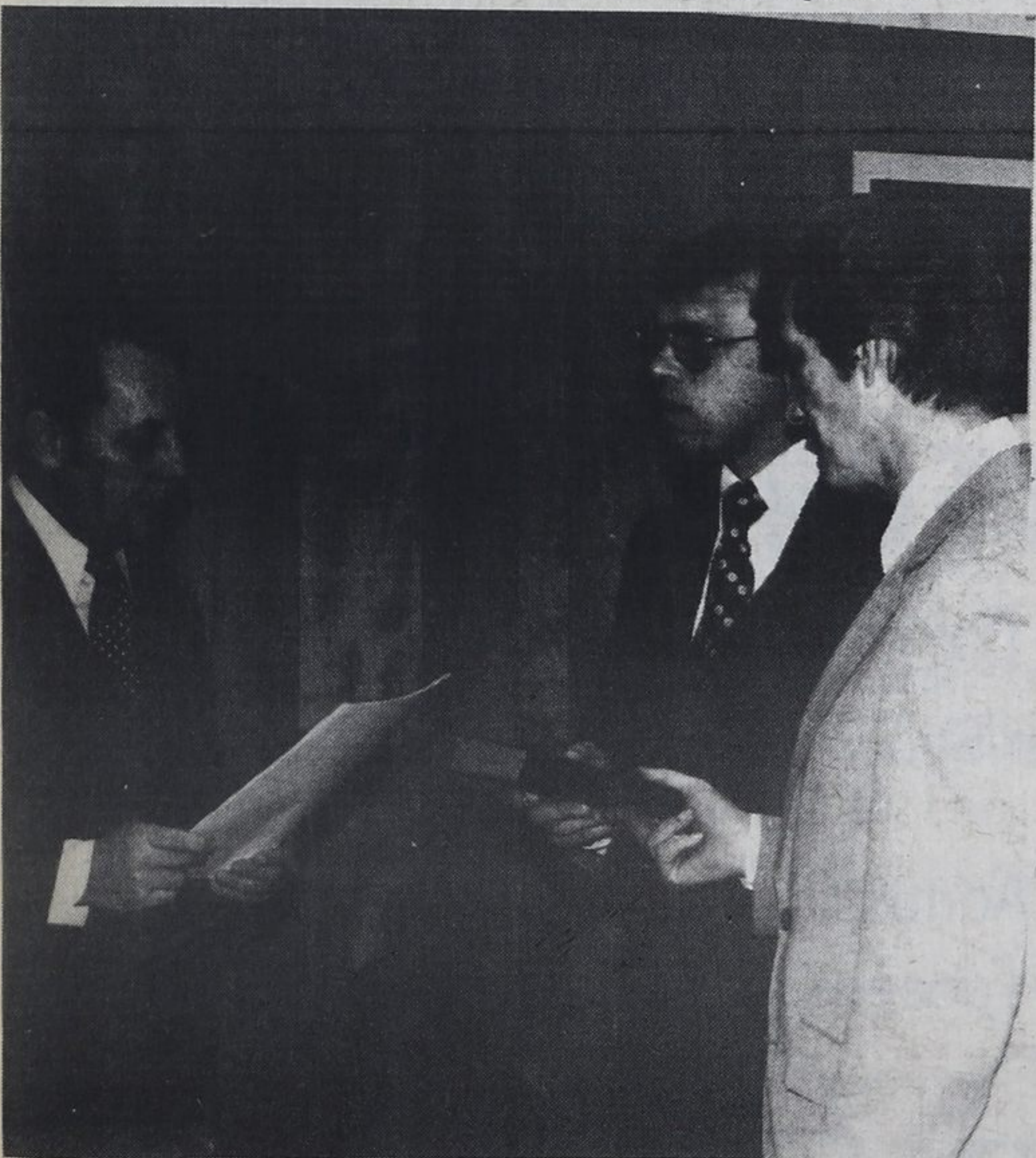
