Rate increases for animal control approved

At Victoria Harbour's council meeting Monday night, it was decided that rate increases would be accepted from Bay Animal Control.

Bay Animal Control is run by George and Margaret Winteler of Fesserton and they are responsible for picking up stray dogs and cats in Tav Township, Port McNicoll and Victoria Harbour.

The basic increases will see the rates rise from \$1.75 per capita to \$2.25 per capita.

That means that the fee is decided upon by multiplying the number of people in Victoria Harbour by \$2.25 and this amount is then divided by 12 months.

A payment is made to the catchers monthly using this formula.
