Exciting Maple Valley snowmobile races set

Maple Valley Snowmobile Club will be holding its ninth annual snowmobile races Dec. 27 and 28 weather permitting.

The race will be held around the quarter mile ice surface track which allows for more action than a half mile or mile track.

The Maple Valley

race track is located at Maple Valley Ski Resort and is oval in shape many race tracks are.

This event usually draws about 200 competitors in the two days of racing with each competitor paying a registration fee of 10 or 15 dollars, depending on the machine they race.

Categories for the

races are super-modified, super-stock, modified, modified-stock, stock A, B, C, D, E, and F and unlimited.

Every category but the stock division costs 15 dollars for registration.

However, the winning drivers in each category get a certain percentage of their registration fee

back based on how high they place in that division.

In addition to that, there will be division trophies with the Huronia Cup going to the driver that accumulates the most points overall in the two days of racing.

There is no cup for the unlimited division.

Admittance for the general public will cost four dollars which is unchanged from last year and there will be a concession booth where you may purchase something to eat or drink.

Both days are set for 12 p.m. starts.

In the past years, these races have attracted racers from as far away as Minnesota and are run basically on Ontario Snowmobile Racing Federation rules.

Anyone wishing to enter the races should show up at the race site the morning of Dec. 27 with their machines.
