A long-time Elmvale area resident passed away Nov. 29 at Penetanguishene General Hospital in his 99th year.

Percival James McConnell, born in Randolph Ontario Jan. 7, 1880, was the son of James McConnell and Margaret Ann (Downer) McConnell. Mr. McConnell resided in Randolph, Midland and then Elmvale.

He was pre-deceased by his wife, the former Rose Grigg in 1968 and his son Douglas in 1972. He leaves to mourn his passing, one daughter Doris (Mrs. Lloyd Widdes of Midland) and five grandchildren.

Mr. McConnell was a farmer while residing in Randolph, a custodian at Parkview School in Midland and resumed farming in Elmvale later. He was a 20 year member of the Anglican Church and was Warden at St. Mary's Anglican Church in Midland when the Parish Hall was constructed.

Funeral services were held Dec. 2 at James H. Lynn Funeral Home in Elmvale with Rev. Gordon Finney presiding and interment was at Elmvale cemetery.

The Expropriations Act

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

In the matter of an application by the Corporation of the Township of Tay for approval to expropriate land being part of Lot 10, Concession 10, more particularly described as Part 1, Plan 51R-9902 in the Township of Tay, in the County of Simcoe for the purpose of improving and enlarging the Waubaushene Water Works.

Notice is hereby given that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described as follows:

All and Singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Township of Tay, in the County of Simcoe and being part of Lot 10, in the 10th Concession of the said Township and more particularly described as Part 1 on a plan of survey dated the 10th day of November, 1980 and registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Simcoe as Plan 51R-9902.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing,

(a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;

(b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

The Approving Authority is the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Tay, Victoria Harbour, Ontario.

Notes:

1. The expropriations Act provides that,

(a) Where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) the inquiry officer,

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:
"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper Land Registry of Sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
