Planning board wants another opinion on rink application

Members of the Midland Planning Board, divided this week over an application to rezone a warehouse to permit the start of a roller disco roller skating business on Heritage Drive, referred the application to the town's recreation and safety committee for its comment.

Ken Burgess, one of the partners in the proposed entreprise, said he and his two partners are considering buying the 16,000 square foot warehouse, sitting on three acres of land owned by Tom Lembo, and adding 4,000 more square feet.

Planning Board members Ed Lawlor and Tom McCullough were concerned about the lack of sidewalks leading to the property, in conjunction with the premise that youngsters would be attracted to come from the nearby William Street area subdivisions on foot.

Some board members also thought it possible that large numbers of vehicles leaving the property at closing time would also cause a problem.

Other board members tended to favour the project, acting chairman Joe Blake said later,


No small consolation


basketball team at Midland Secondary School went as far as the consolation round in Barrie Central's Invitational Basketball Tournament, Saturday.
