She scored 8.10 and looked very impressive. Although Crystal Manson didn't win any ribbons, improvement over last year's scores were evident. Her composite score of 27.22 was four marks short of the leader.

Many coaches from some of the other clubs came over and commented on the improvement that they noticed in our club. The remarks were music to our ears.
