Wayne Busch named chairman of Metro Group

Georgian College President Wayne Busch has been elected chairman of the Central Region Committee of Presidents of the Ontario Community Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology.

Known as the Metro Group, the committee also includes the presidents of Seneca, Centennial, Humber, George Brown and Sheridan Colleges.

Busch was elected recently by the Committee to replace outgoing Chairman Jack Porter, who is retiring as President of Sheridan College. The Metro Group represents about half the College student population in the Province of Ontario.

The position is normally a one-year term, beginning July 1, but since Porter is retiring now. Busch's term will last one-and-a-half years. He will also sit on the executive of the Provincial Committee of Presidents.

Busch says the committee meets on a regular basis to discuss items of mutual concern and to establish common ways of dealing with a variety of situations concerning


the Colleges.

"We have a strong executive which provides an important collaboration and strong, mutual support. As a group we can have a direct influence on the direction of Community Colleges in general and (as a member) of Georgian College in particular," he adds.

One of the major priorities of the committee will be in looking at the matter of growth

of Community Colleges, particularly in the Central Region where the situation is serious.

Georgian College was a member of the Eastern Group of Community Colleges until last year when it was decided by the College Board of Governors that Georgian's involvement with the Metro Group would be more practical and beneficial to the College.


