One of the two objections to Midland's height restriction bylaw, which was forwarded by council Dec. 22 to the Ontario Municipal Board along with a request for a hearing, has been withdrawn.

Objectors Betty Ann and Frederick Graham indicated their dropping of opposition in a letter received by the town office Dec. 22.

The Grahams, and John Gorman, were the two parties who originally filed objections to the bylaw passed by council in September that raises the height restriction for a building on a Bayshore Drive property to 35 metres from 15 metres.
