Equalized assessment is calculated by ap-

plying a factor to the 1975 market value of a property. These factors differ in each municipality, and according to five classes (Residential, Multi-residential, Commercial, Industrial and Farm).

Equalized assessment was introduced in order to update the value at which properties are assessed for tax pur-In poses. some municipalities outdated property values have been in use for several decades.

It is felt by most municipal councils that the new equalization will mean a more fair assessment for property owners as reflected in their taxes.
