

Local teams vie for play-off positions

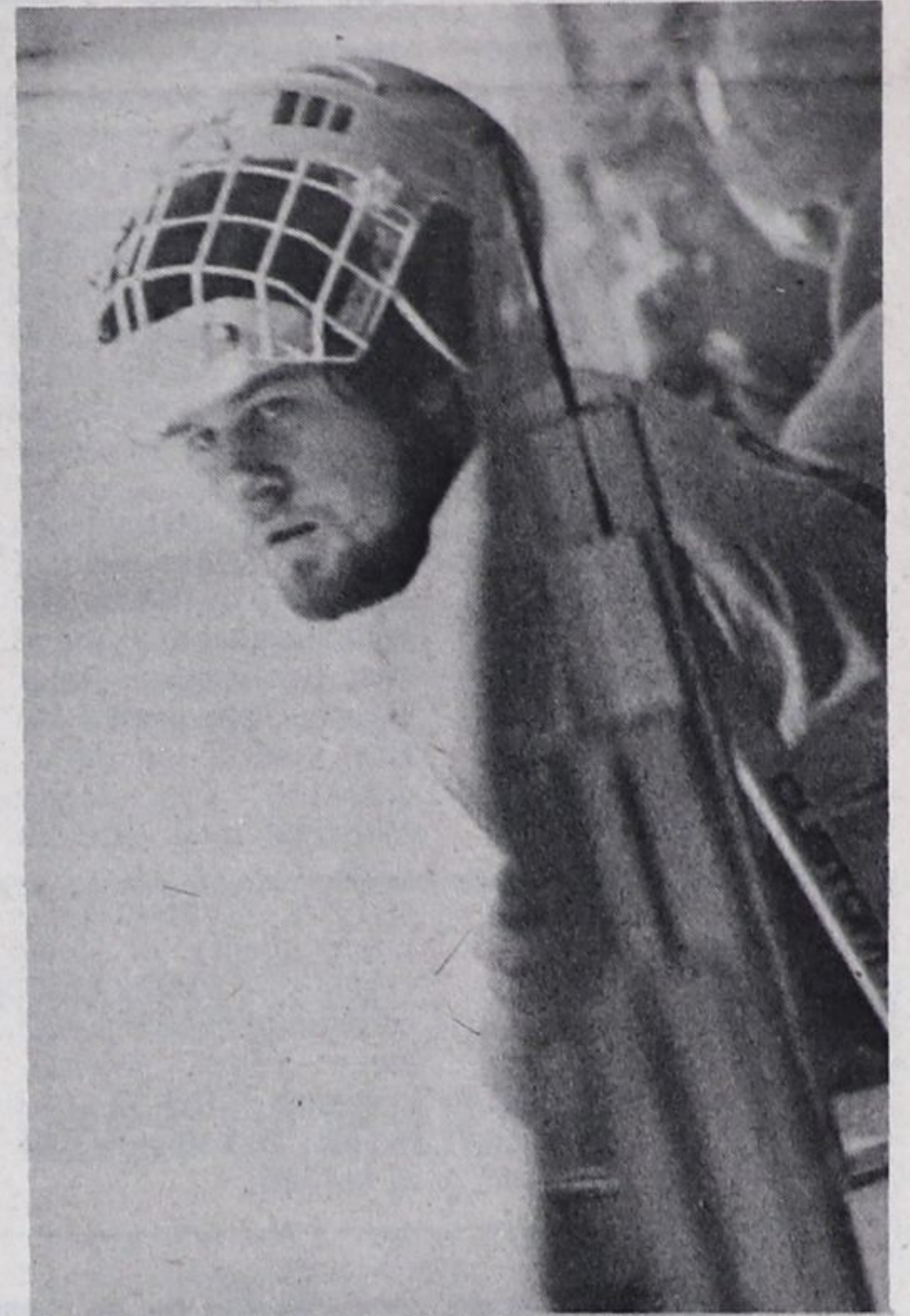
