2. Schedule 2, consisting of the following: i. An explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law.

ii. A key map which shows the location of the lands to which the by-law applies (or, where there is no key map, an explanation as to why a key map is not included).

3. Schedule 3, being a statement from the Chief Planning Officer of the municipality in which the land to which the by-law applies is situate.

ANY PERSON INTERESTED MAY, within twenty-one (21) days after the date of the mailing, personal service or publication of this notice, file with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Midland notice of an objection to the approval of the said By-law or part thereof together with details of all or that portion of the By-law to which there is objection and detailed reasons thereof.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the By-law may, within twenty-one (21) days after the date of the mailing, personal service or publication of this notice, file with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Midland notice of support of the application for approval of the said By-law.

If no notice of objection has been filed with the Clerk of the municipality within the time provided, the By-law thereupon comes into effect and does not require the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.

If a notice of objection has been filed with the Clerk of the municipality within the time provided, the By-law shall be submitted to the Ontario Municipal Board and the By-law does not come into effect until approved by the Ontario Municipal Board.

The last date for filing objections is February 5, 1981.

The objection must be received by this date in order to be valid.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MIDLAND BY-LAW NO. 80-93

Being a By-law of the Corporation of the Town of Midland to amend Restricted area By-law No. 79-40.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Midland passed Restricted Area By-law No. 79-40, known as the Zoning By-

law, on the 17th day of July, 1979, to regulate the development and use of lands within the Town of Midland, and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Midlandnow deems it expedientto amend Restricted Area By-law 79-40, pursuant to the authority given to it under Section 35 of the Planning Act, T.S.O. 1970, Chapter 349, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MIDLAND ENACTS AND BE IT ENACTED AS FOLLOWS:-

1. That PERSONAL SERVICE ESTABLISH-MENT in SECTION 2-DEFINITIONS be deleted in its entirety and be replaced with the following:

"PERSONAL SERVICE ESTABLISH-MENT" shall mean a building or part of a building wherein services are provided to the public such as a barbershop, hairdressing establishments, beauty salons (cosmetic) a shoe repair shop, a watch and jewellery repair shop and uses associated thereto.

2. All provisions of By-law 79-40 except those expressly amended herein shall apply to the subject lands.

3. This By-law shall take effect from the date of passage by Council and shall come into force if no objections are received after circulation, by the attachment of a certificate under Section 35(27) of the Planning Act or, in the event of objections, upon the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.

By-law read a first, second and third time and finally passed in Open Council this 24th day of November, 1980.

In order to eliminate the ambiguity in the wording of the existing definition of a PERSONAL SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT as contained in SECTION 2 - DEFINITIONS of By-law No. 79-40; By-law No. 80-93 has been enacted to provide a more concise Definition of a Personal Service Establishment to assist in the interpretation of the By-law.
