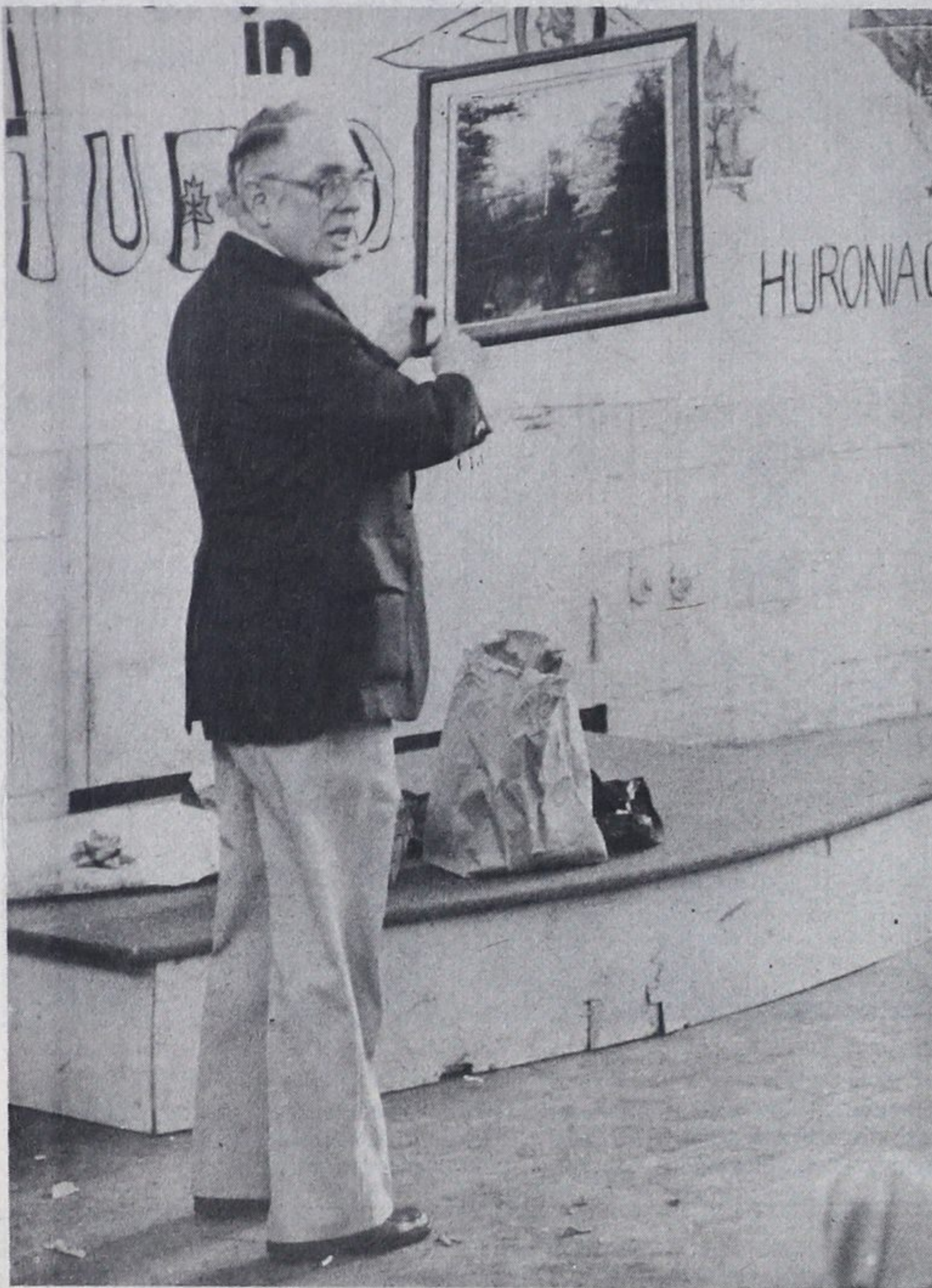
The second meeting of the Waverley 4-H was held on Sat., Jan. 31 at Mrs. Leonards.

The young man was an employee of RCA and living in Victoria Harbour. He was single. He was a baseball player as well as a

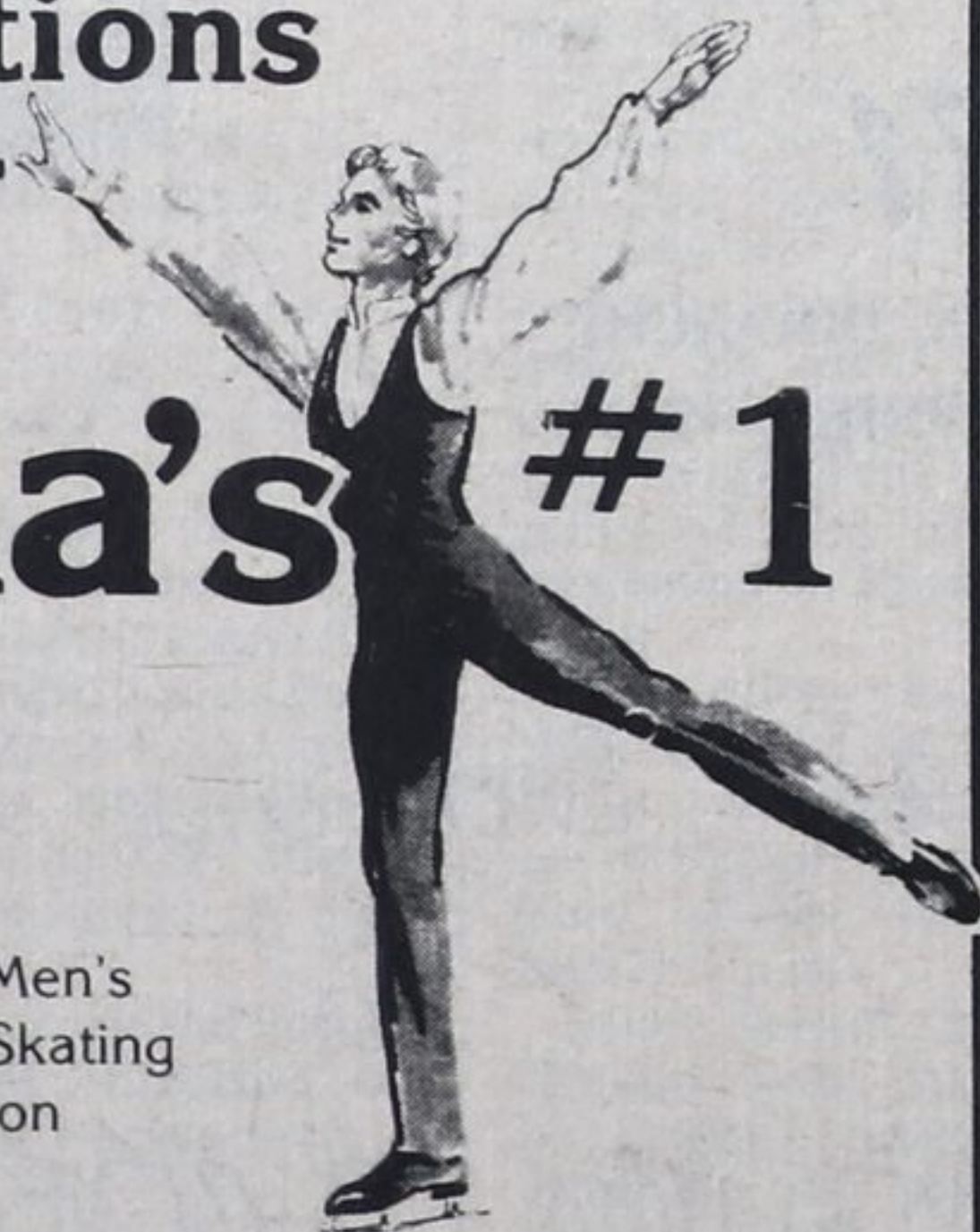
hockey player. He was a member of the Midland Athenian Raiders baseball club.

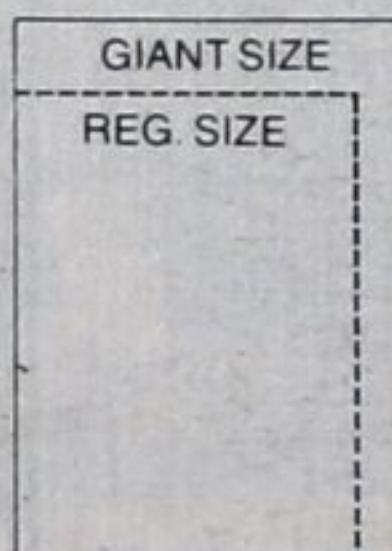
