

# ARC floor hockey team puts on good show in California

the group about \$9,000.

Team coach, Paul McDonald, said that the trip was very worthwhile and the team played very hard, maybe because they were the only Canadian team at the tournament.

But the trip wasn't all work for the players as they had time for relaxation.

While in California,

the players were across the border in Mexico for a day and they visited Universal studios, Seaworld and Disneyland.

According to McDonald, though, the highlight of their trip was on the plane when they met former Iranian hostage, Richard Morfield who was delighted to have

met some Canadians.

A large press following was in attendance for this meet.

The ARC team played Costa Mesa in their first game in which they claimed a 5-4 win but fell short in their second game to San Diego 6-4.

They recovered in the third game by defeating Los Angeles 6-4 and then lost a squeaker 5-4 to

Bakersfield.

The ARC team won their next game 5-3 over Pamona Valley and then were doubled by TriValley 6-3 in their final game.

Playing in net for ARC were Mike McKee and Joe Quesnelle and Leo Prisque was honoured for Midland by being chosen to the all-star team.
