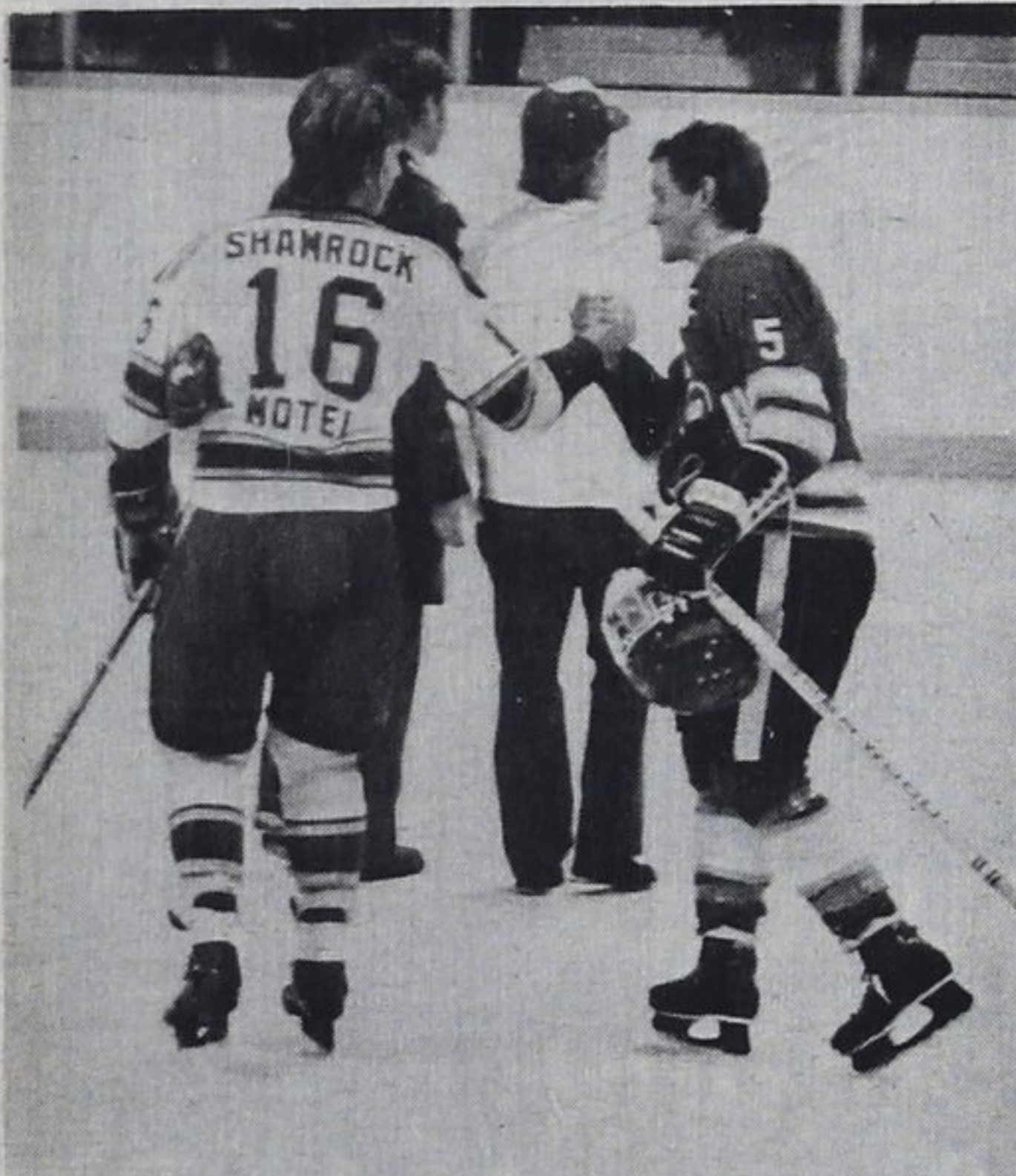
Teachers down students

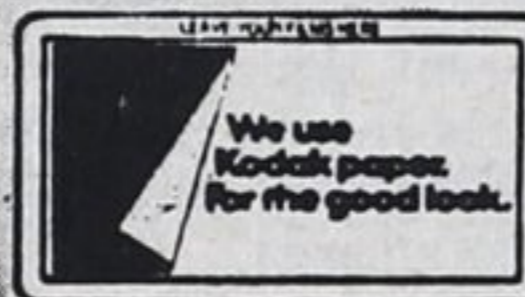
