BIA president sees no danger from waterfront hotel

Midland Downtown **Business Improvement** Area President Peter Palmer says John Gorman is being "overly protective" in his opposition to the building of a proposed 600-unit hotel on the waterfront.

Such a development, which Annedol Investments had initially said would include a convention centre, "can't help but be good" for the downtown merchants, he said.

"Don't tell me that

people will sit down there and not radiate district, Palmer said. "you would be naive to think so."

The BIA, he said, realizes that development is inevitable. It has to revitalize the downtown, whatever happens. It's objective is to be established "by the time the big shooters come around." The BIA isn't in that position yet, he added, but we're working on it.

Palmer said
