Trainers program still a possibility in area

The level one trainer's program cancelled several weeks ago may be rescheduled if sufficient support is found for the program.

The project is run to increase the awareness of player safety and injury prevention in trainers of hockey teams and to teach

participants about the best possible treatment for any variety of injuries a hockey player may incur.

The clinic is open to anyone and all team trainers should attend, experienced or not.

Coaches, manager and parents are also welcomed as well as players midget age and

above and officials.

The clinic will cover the responsibilities of the trainer, legal implications, medical authorities, basic anatomy and care of muscle injuries, flexibility and conditioning, nutrition, equipment, female players and how to treat them, and mechanisms of injury in hockey and

primary care.

The presentation of this subject matter will be through lectures, visual aids, group discussions and demonstrations.

A reference manual is provided for everyone entered in the program and the program is three and a half hours in length.

A take home exam will be given to participants in the course and you can use the manual for that exam.

To obtain your trainer certificate, you must have completed the level one course, answered and mailed in your written exam and have a first aid certificate, the minimum being a St. John Ambulance Emergency Course.

The first aid course may be taken before or after the trainer's clinic.

A minimum of 20 people is required for a level one trainer's clinic to be held with a maximum of 40.

Fee for the clinic is eight dollars and that includes registration, reference manual, year subscription to Hockey Scope, a certificate (upon completion of certification process), coffee break and decal.

Once certified, trainers have access to the Trainers Reference Library at the Hockey Ontario Development Committee Headquarters in Toronto.
