Religious ed. committee report

The Religious **Education Committee of** the Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board met on Feb. 23 and again on March 11, primarily to discuss the evaluation components of the Canadian Catechism and to propose further Focus on Faith for the Future (F.F.F.) activities for the R.C. board for the balance of the school year.

At the first meeting the chairman reviewed the activities of the committee over the past year for the benefit of new members. She explained that the committee had undertaken a summer 1980 study of the Grade 8 catechetics course content.

It was agreed that the programme was a very worthwhile and comprehensive year of

study and contained a large component of explicit teaching relative to the Sacraments, grace, the Church, liturgical seasons, etc. which had been areas of concern.

The teaching strategies were, understandably, a little different from traditional methods of catechesis and the committee felt a certain urgency in getting this explanation to parents.

They urged again that newsletters and general communications from school should often include reference to the religion programme so that parents could reinforce the concepts taught in the home Such setting. references would be a constant reminder to all of our unique "raison d'etre", R.C. board trustees were told Wednesday.
