Marina fire Monday tops list in three municipalities

A fire at Penetanguishene Marine and Aviation Services Ltd. Monday afternoon was the most serious of three fires in the Penetanguishene-Midland-Tiny Township area since Sunday.

Penetanguishene Fire Chief Ted Light estimated damage to the unoccupied building fronting the bay off Champlain Road to be in excess of \$5,000. The building contained washrooms and unused office space.

Chief Light said the fire started in below-floor joists and worked upwards into a room containing electrical distribution panels and then into the ceiling. An electric heating wire wrapped around water pipes under the floor to keep the water from freezing appeared to be the source of the fire.

A portion of the wire was crushed between a beam and the water pipe because of the heaving action of frost in the ground.

At about the same

time Monday afternoon Tinv Township firemen responded to a fire on the property of Alvin Montgomery on Con. 6.

An unfinished single car

garage, without wiring or heating, burned while the nearby house was saved. Fire Chief Guy Maurice estimated damage to be between \$1,000 and \$1,500.

Perrin property purchase delayed going to OMB

A motion to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval to purchase the "Perrin property" and convert it into a municipal parking lot (at a total cost of \$100,000) was turned down Monday night in Midland when council met.

The matter was to have been dealt with at a later in-camera meeting the same night.

Alderman Bev Day wanted to know where the money was to come from to pay for the property and convert it into a parking lot, saying the town's parking authority would be hard-pressed to pay for the project on a self-liquidating basis since taxes on parking lots in town have risen this year from \$3,000 to \$15,000 due to market value assessment.

Mavor Moreland Lynn said the town hasn't changed its policy and that such costs would continue to be borne by the authority.

Alderman William Orr opted not to discuss the matter saying his business was located near the proposed parking lot thus citing a possible conflict of interest.

Alderman Bob Jeffery in moving the matter be dealt with in caucus said he didn't feel there was need for a parking lot in that area.

Later a majority of council agreed to have the matter again discussed behind closed doors.

In other business before council, Alderman Orr noted former chamber of commerce manager William Vidler would be moving away from Midland.

Orr proposed a letter be sent to Vidler calling attention to Vidler's "many services to Midland and expressing our thanks."

Mavor Lynn echoed Orr's remarks and added, "Bill has worked very,

very hard for this community."

And a resolution to terminate a fire protection agreement with Tay Township failed when a majority of council turned thumbs down on a motion put forward by Alderman Joe Blake.

Blake expressed concerns that the cost of firefighting and related services in Midland could soon rise to \$500,000 per year while an agreement with the township to protect an area of Tav amounted to \$12,000.

He cited a portion of the Mental Health Centre (Oak Ridge) the town now has to protect in addition to sections of Sunnyside, etc.

It was finally agreed to again sit down with officials from Tay in an effort to work out a new agreement so as not to make any enemies.

Alderman Al Hennin was one of a number of local councillors who spoke up Monday night against terminating the agreement.
