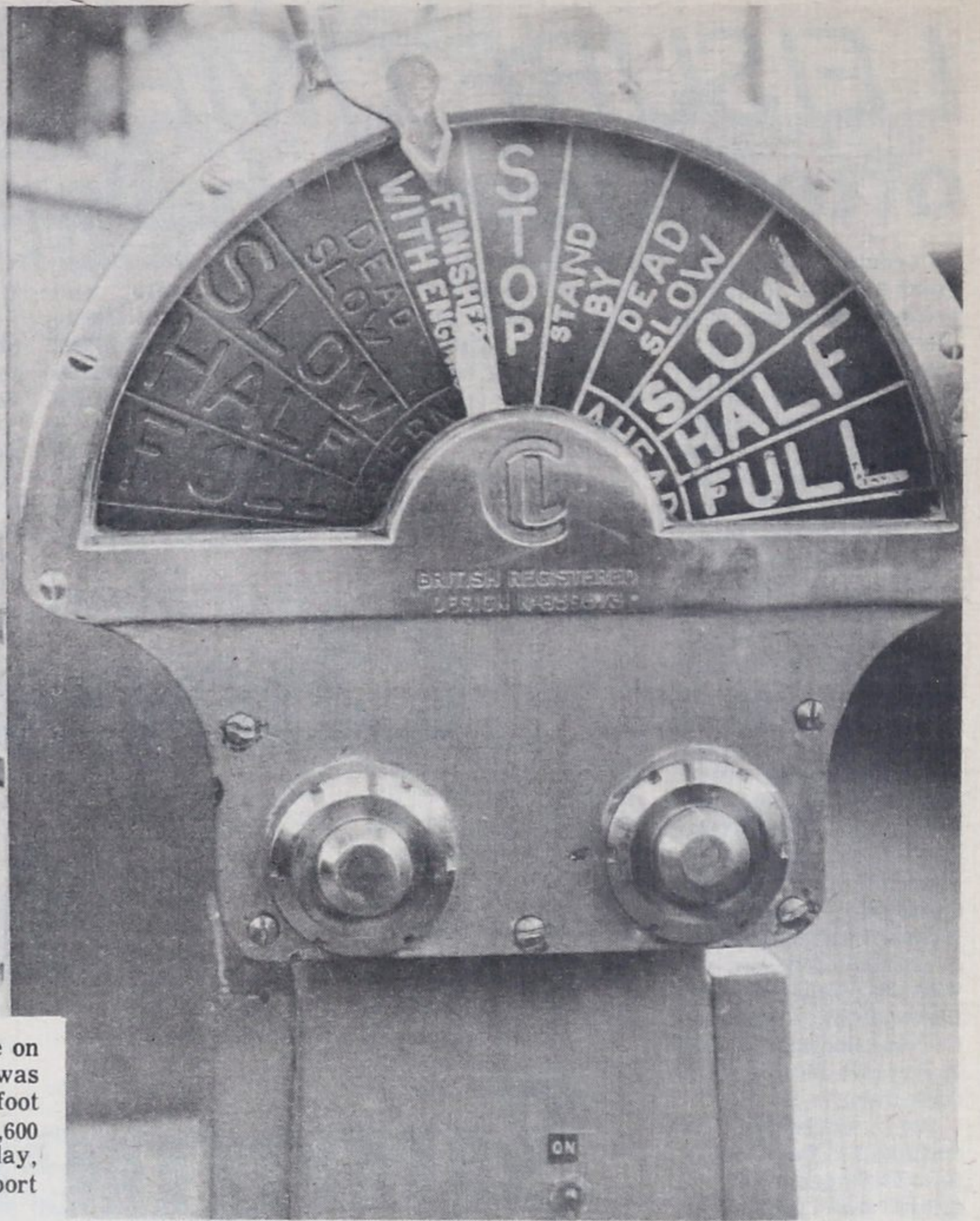




Pride of the Misener fleet

Millie Allport, president gave a report on the year's activities of the Society in this area which included an educational program on the care of pets taken to the public schools, and of the poster competition which was held in conjunction with the educational program.

Various fund raising events were held, such as lottery ticket sales, tag day, garage sale, ride-a-thon and booths at the Midland town sidewalk sale and Fall Fair.

All of these ventures were successful and the Humane Society would like to thank everyone who donated to the Society in aiding prevention of cruelty to animals.

Mr. A. Froom was the guest speaker at this meeting. He is the Director of the Education Program for the Ontario Humane Society as well as Past President.

He talked on the structure of the Humane

Society including staffing. He mentioned that managers of the Animal Shelters have one of the most difficult and emotional jobs within the Society.

He mentioned the animal industry ranks seventh in the country emphasizing the need for animal care education.

He discussed the proposed new head office for the Humane Society which would be completed in 1985 in Newmarket.

The Society hopes to make use of the new buildings to sponsor educational courses for universities and the farm community on animal welfare.

Although not an Inspector, Mr. Froom did give an account of two animal investigations he attended explaining the care and concern that is used

when taking animals to the Humane Society farm for protection.

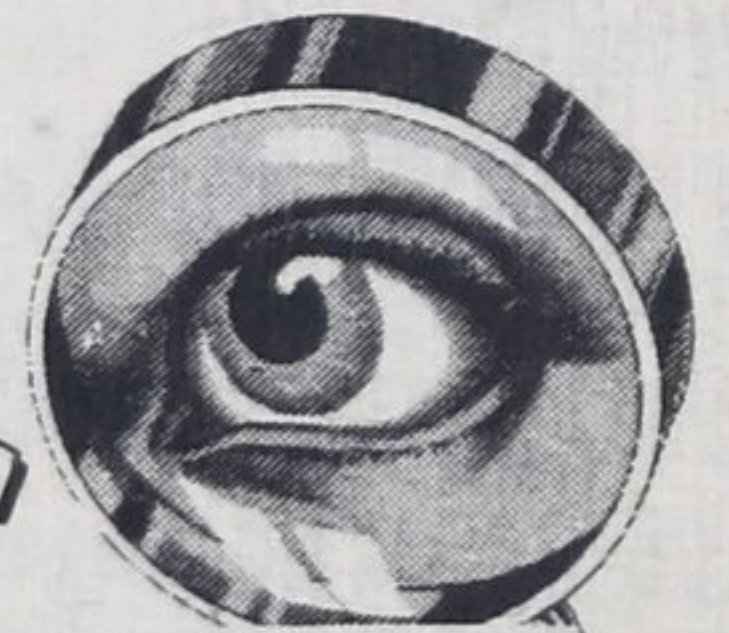
