## The new London bus rides

Two new bus services have been inaugurated at London's Heathrow Airport, linking the three terminals with Central London.

The Airbuses run daily year round (except for Christmas Day) and cost two pounds for adults, one pound for children.

Canadian dollars are accepted on the bus, as is the Go-As-You-Please ticket, which gives unlimited travel on London's buses and tubes.

The Airbus A1 leaves every 20 minutes, and goes to Grosvenor Gardens, near Victoria Station, via Cromwell Road and Hyde Park Corner.

Airbus A2 goes via Shepherds Bush and Bayswater Road to Sussex Gardens and Paddington, leaving every 30 minutes. Each terminal at Heathrow is marked with easily-identified signs to the Airbus stop.
