Developmental Program

Due to the success of our program and the resulting increase in the number of participants, we were forced to turn many people away. We are planning to correct this situation so that more gymnasts can enjoy our program.

Conclusion

If our plans work out to our satisfaction we would end up with a total of five divisions, three at the developmental level and two at the competitive level.

We would also be working out for a total



of 25 hours per week using two facilities and employing approximately 15 people.

This new system would allow us to expand from our present 120 gymnasts to possibly 150. We are hoping to have a ratio of five or six gymnasts to one coach.

I find this kind of growth very impressive. It points out that there is definitely a need for this kind of programming in Huronia.
