

## Wunderbar campaign in Germany

### Travel news, views

To extend their "Wunderbar" campaign, the German National Tourist Office has come up with a novel idea for those more energetically inclined.

To celebrate 100 years of bicycling in Germany, a seven day bicycling tour has been devised, in the Frankfurt area.

Apart from enjoying cycling, it is a good way to meet people, to enjoy the landscape and explore romantic villages.

A bus will cart the luggage, and occasionally a tired biker. If this still sounds too much like an endurance test, there is a seven day stage-coach tour through Bavaria, called the Wunderbuggy.

You will be driven in a stage coach by four horses, through peasant villages, large forests and the Alps.

Whichever way you decide to experience the country, these two programs are offered through travel agents across Canada, by Canadian Travel Abroad.

#### Cholera Shots

The South African Tourist Corporation in Toronto reports that anyone who plans to visit Swaziland, even if only passing through this small independent state, must be in possession of a certificate of vaccination against cholera before being allowed entry into the country.

The route through Swaziland is popular with motorists travelling between Johannesburg and Durban.

# New licensing for motorcycles, mopeds

Now that spring has officially arrived, many area motorbike en-

thusiasts will be preparing their vehicles for another summer of

riding. The licensing system has changed this year

though, and the Ministry of Transportation and Com-

munications says that plates or permits will no longer be issued each year.

According to the Ministry, recent changes mean that motorcycle and moped plates will remain legal and be validated annually by means of a sticker.

On 1980 plates, the sticker should be placed at the top centre between the "Ont" and the "1980". New plates issued will provide space for validation in the upper righthand corner.

A new multi-year permit will also be issued to register motorcycles and mopeds, similar to those

used for passenger cars.
