Bicycle safety for whole family a must

There are traffic rules that should be followed in order to secure that your cycling pastime is safe.

1. Obey all traffic signs and signals.
2. Ride on the right side of the road.
3. Ride in single file.
4. Stop before riding onto the street from a driveway.
5. Walk your bicycle across any busy intersection and at crosswalks.
6. Give the required hand signals when you

7. Transport parcels or books in a proper carrier.
8. Never ride two on a bicycle.
9. Never hitch a ride on another vehicle.
10. No trick riding on streets or highways.
11. Be alert for vehicles

12. Make sure your bicycle is equipped with required safety devices.
13. Make sure your bicycle is in good mechanical repair.

If all these thirteen basic traffic rules are followed, it will make your cycling safe and very enjoyable.
