In the Intermediate Division: Tammy Hocken, first place for How To Make Root Beer and Suzan Margison second place for Telsa

Coil. There were two special awards given

out as well, one for the best over-all project involving living science and one for the best physical science project.

Because Andy Beardsall of Elmvale won the plaque for the best life science project in all grade levels, the school also receives a plaque to commemorate the occasion.
