Historical find

Ladouceur's uncle says the lead piece, inscribed Hudson Bay, Prime Western, Made in Canada, dates back to the 1930's and 1940's and could possibly be a monument cornerstone.

Police, firemen called to blaze

Flos-Elmvalle Fire Department and the Elmvalle OPP were called to the scene of a fire last Tuesday when a tow truck became engulfed in flames.

OPP report the vehicle, owned by Perry Ritchie of Brooks, Alberta, had its cab gutted by the blaze, after Ritchie noticed smoke coming from under the hood and escaped.

The fire took place on Flos Concession 6-7 and caused an estimated \$3,000 damage.
