Charlie Colling .. What are warrants and rights of their function? H.C. Penetanguishene.

Warrants are usually issued with a primary or original distribution of a stock or debenture of a company as an enticement for the investor to put money into a particular issue.

Hence you might see ABC Company issue ten million shares of stock at ten dollars per share cum warrants. These warrants give the investor the option of additional buying shares of the company over a predetermined period of time.

For example: John it in the garbage. buys five hundred shares of ABC Company at ten dollars per share sure you open all the cum warrants in May of 1981. The warrants what you are tossing entitle him to buy an out. It makes a lot of additional five hundred unecessary work and is shares at ten dollars per share after May of 1982 and before May of 1985 when the warrants expire.

Thus if the price of ABC Company goes to twenty dollars per share and John feels they price offering. could go higher he exercises his warrants at ten dollars per share to hold one thousand shares.


