The group managed 2,902 points for their win.

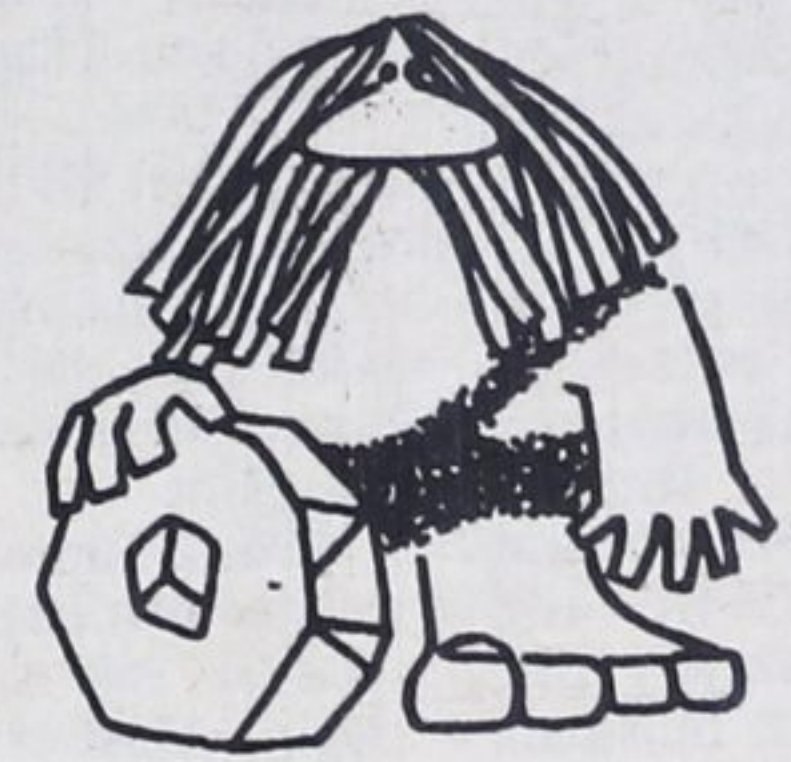
Opening ceremonies were performed by

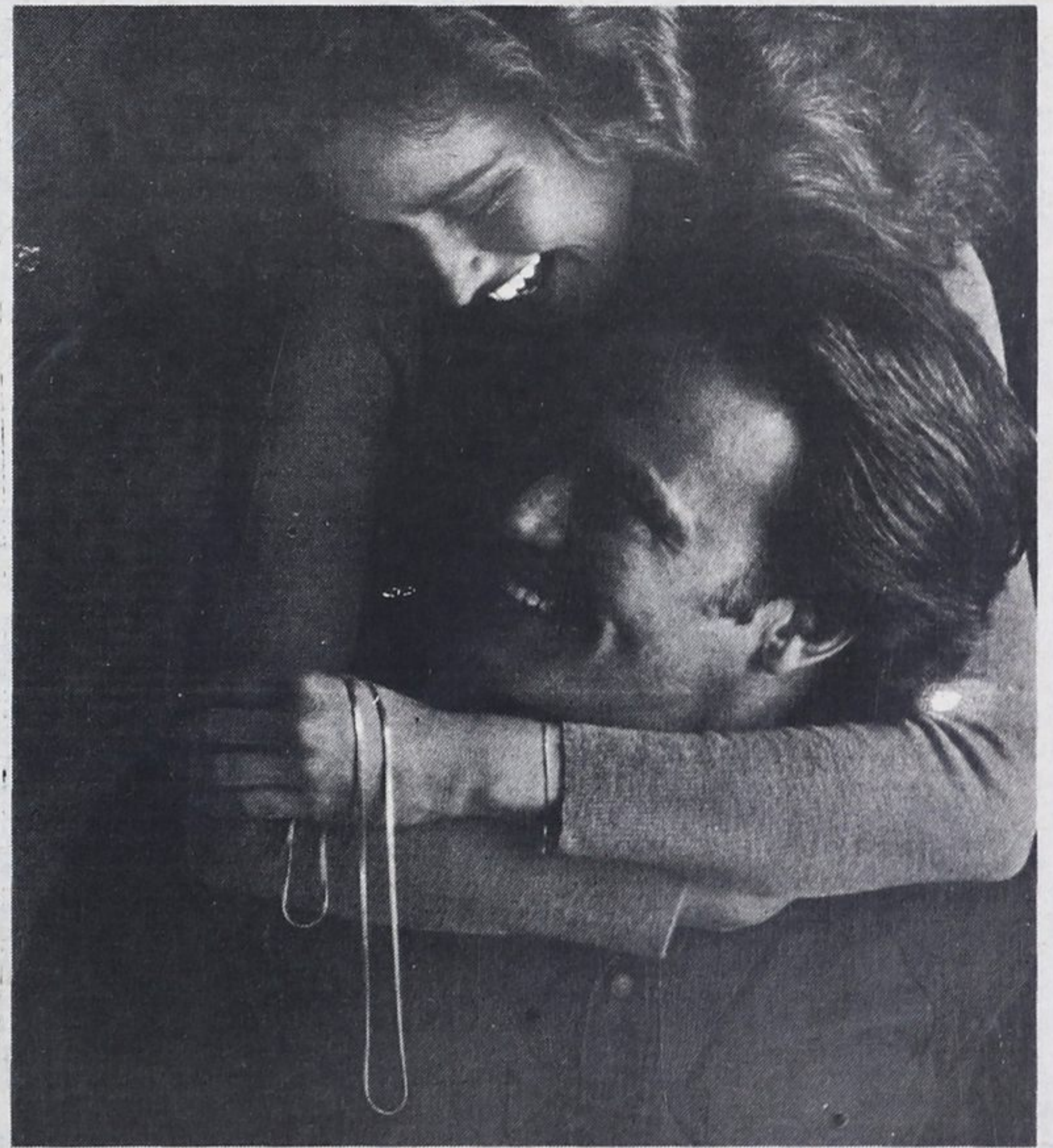
