There's a building boom in Tiny these days

The estimated value of building construction in Tiny Township for the first quarter of 1981 is up \$667,900 over the previous year, according to building inspector Larry Crawford.

In 1980 a total of 42 building permits were issued for an estimated construction value of \$534,600 from Jan. 1 to April 30.

Sixty-six permits were issued before April These figures were 30 this year for a total

In summary, the building inspector states, "24 more building permits were issued--13 more for the construction of new

seasonal dwellings and three more for new permanent dwellings."

Deputy-reeve John Lackie expressed surprise over the increase in building, and speculated that builders were "maybe trying to beat the re-imposition of sales tax on materials in June."

"They're also learning to live with high mortgage rates," Lackie added.
