# 26 crashes in Midland during month of April

During the month of April, Midland police probed a total of 18 reportable and eight non-reportable motor-vehicle accidents in town.

At least a dozen persons suffered injuries as a result of being involved in some of the above crashes, Police Chief Ernest Bate's April monthly activity report shows.

It was tabled Monday night during a regular meeting of Midland council.

The document also notes, there were 35 charges laid under the Criminal Code, 22 under the Liquor

Control Act, 93 under the Highway Traffic Act (including 63 for speeding), two under other provincial statutes, 51 under local bylaws and one charge under the Narcotics Control Act.

Alderman Ian Ross pointed out to his colleagues around the council table while reviewing the report, that there had been 624 parking tags issued in April.

Last month police here in town also investigated six cases of house break-ins and five of shop break-ins.

scheduling and timetables, and the administration of student financial aid programs. In her new assignment, Mrs. Hicks will report to the Director of Finance and Administration.

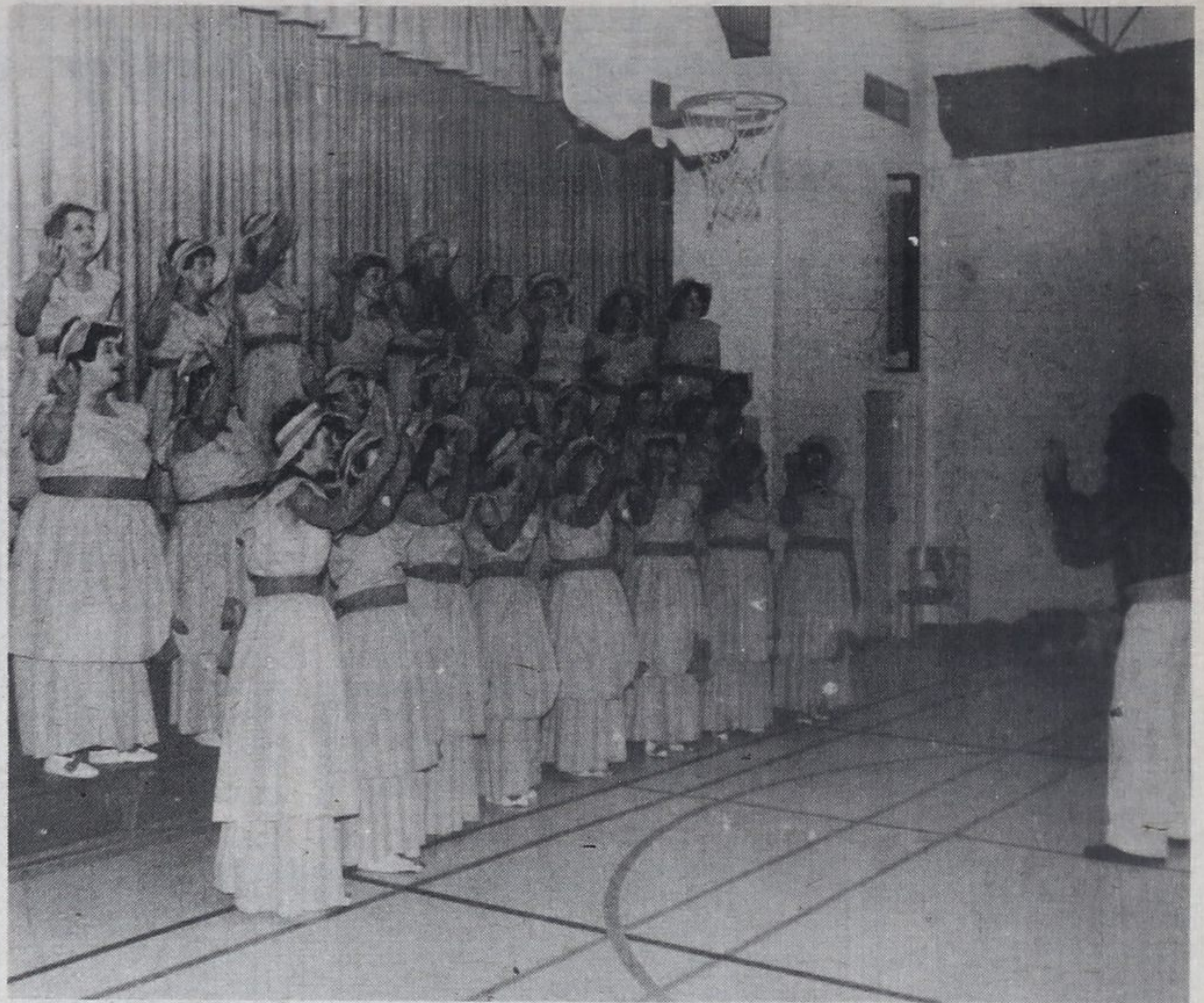
In announcing the appointment, President Busch said the valuable organizational and motivational abilities demonstrated by Mrs. Hicks throughout her extensive career both before and since her association with

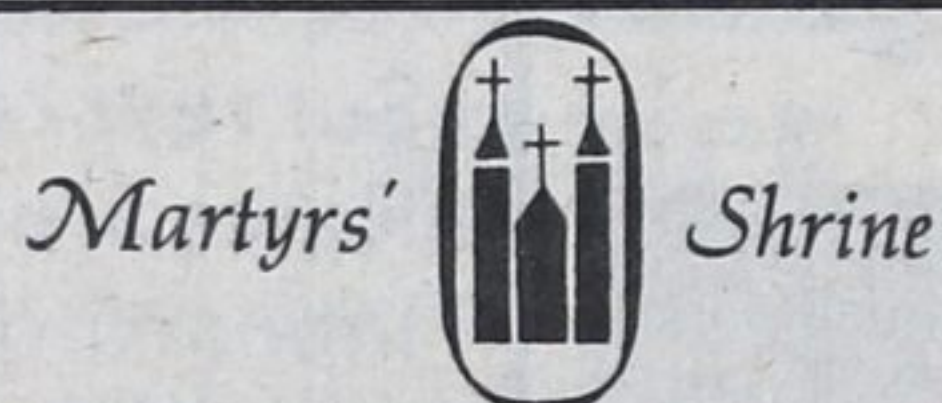

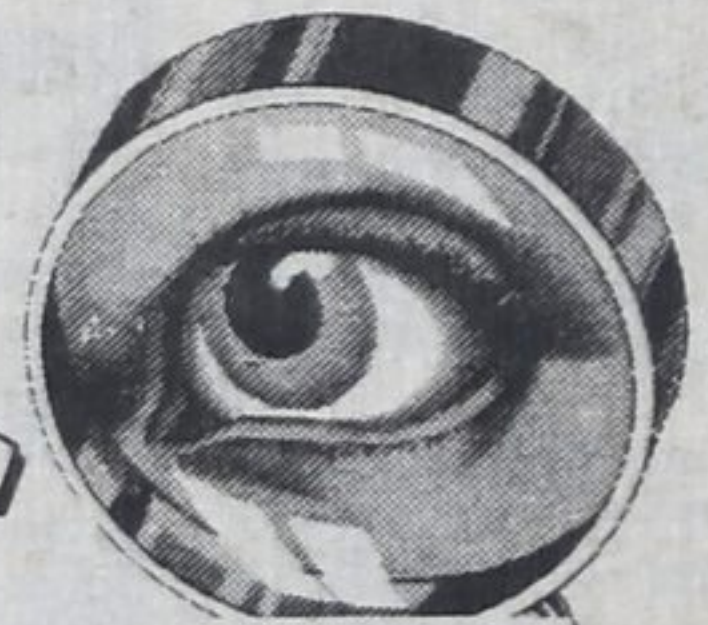
