Misses Eleanor and Joan Evans of Toronto weekended with their parents Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Evans.

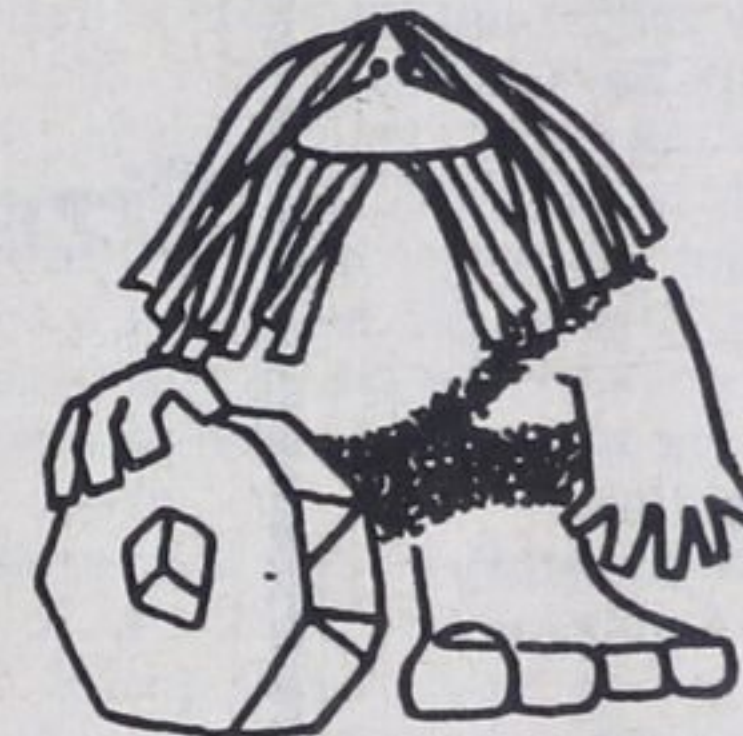
Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hunt returned from spending the winter in Florida.
