

# Bolton National Horse Show attracts locals

The Bolton National Horse Show on the weekend lived up to its reputation as one of Canada's biggest and most prestigious horse shows.

This year saw entries top the 700 mark; with horses and riders from across Ontario, Quebec as well as New York, Michigan, Wisconsin and Georgia and as far away as Mexico and Germany.

The high brightly coloured tents which

housed the hundreds of horses stabled for the occasion lent a festival atmosphere to the event.

Amid this international setting the Midland area was well represented by coach Don Betts and two of his crestwood riders, Toni Lembo and Toni's younger brother Tom.

Tom competed in the highly competitive large Pony Division which saw ap-

proximately 90 ponies entered in two flights.

Nine-year-old Tom Lembo was eliminated in the first equitation class over three foot fences.

Coach Bett's persistence together with Tom's and "Training Wheels" growing confidence saw marked improvement over the next two courses until in the Pony Hunter over Fences Stake Class they put in

a strong performance winning a fifth place

Tom's older sister Toni rode both "Something Ventured" and "Prize Jive" in eight back to back classes. Toni and her mounts brought back two sixth, two seventh and eighth place ribbons.

The pinnacle of Crestwood's day however was Toni and "Prize Jive" sterling performance to take first place in the Hunter over Fences Class.

The time for both those tournaments is 8.15 p.m.

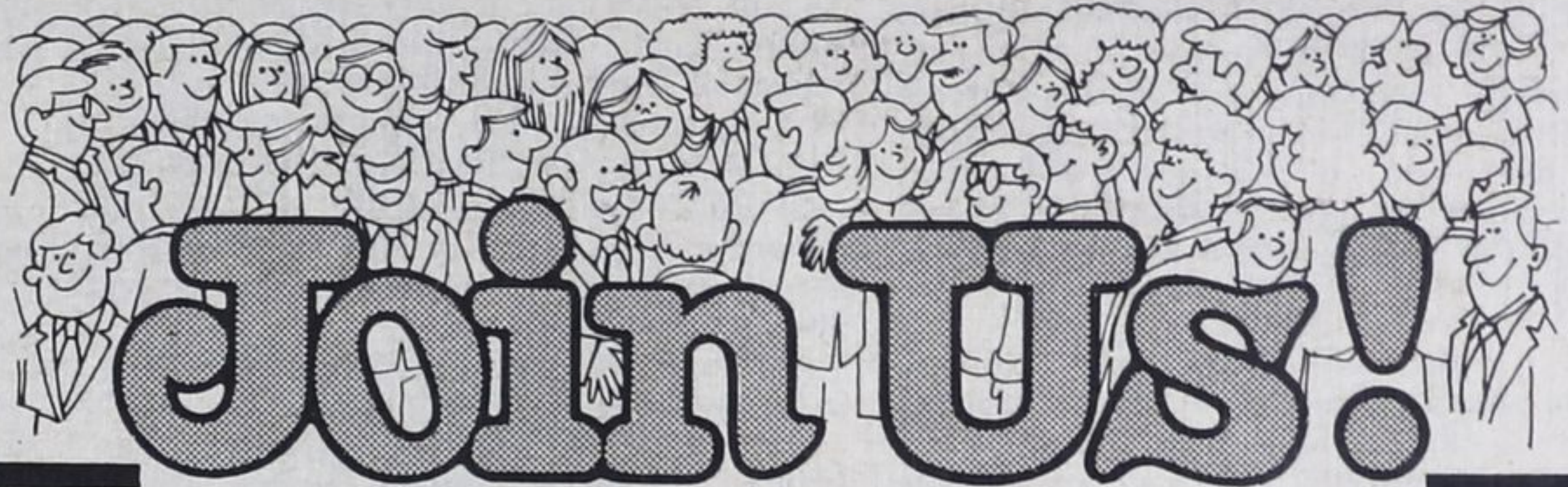
Funds received in the campaign will pay for nets and posts for the courts and the wooden border surrounding the courts.

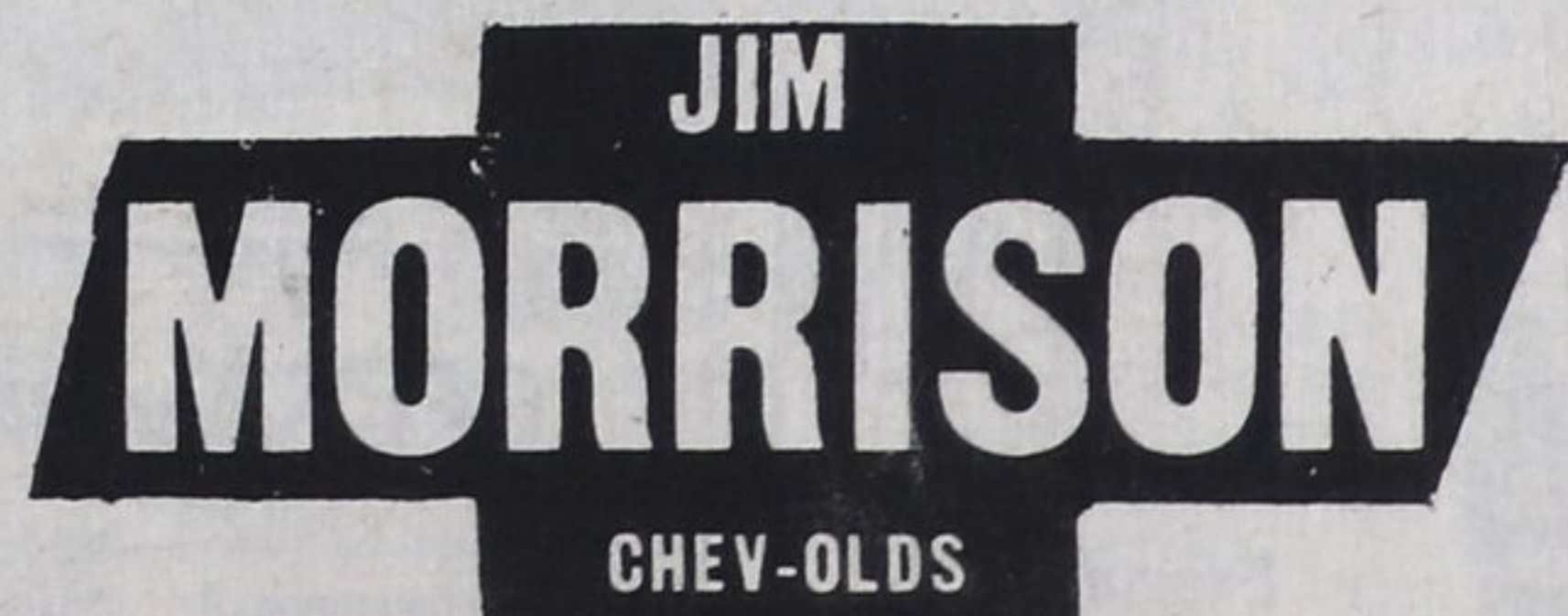
