Census results could see the House increased

Under Canadian law, Manitoba population figures determine the number of representatives in the House of Commons, and currect projections indicate that after the 1981 Census, on June 3, the total number is expected to increase by approximately 30.

The estimate is based on Statistics Canada population projections will gain thirteen seats; Alberta, five; Quebec, four; British Columbia, four; Nova Scotia, two;

and Newfoundland, one each.

Following the receipt of the new census figures in the fall of 1982, calculations on the apportionment of seats will be carried out by the Chief Electoral Officer.
