Students of Grades six, seven and eight were granted permission to go to Ottawa June 1-5, a total of 42 young people in all.

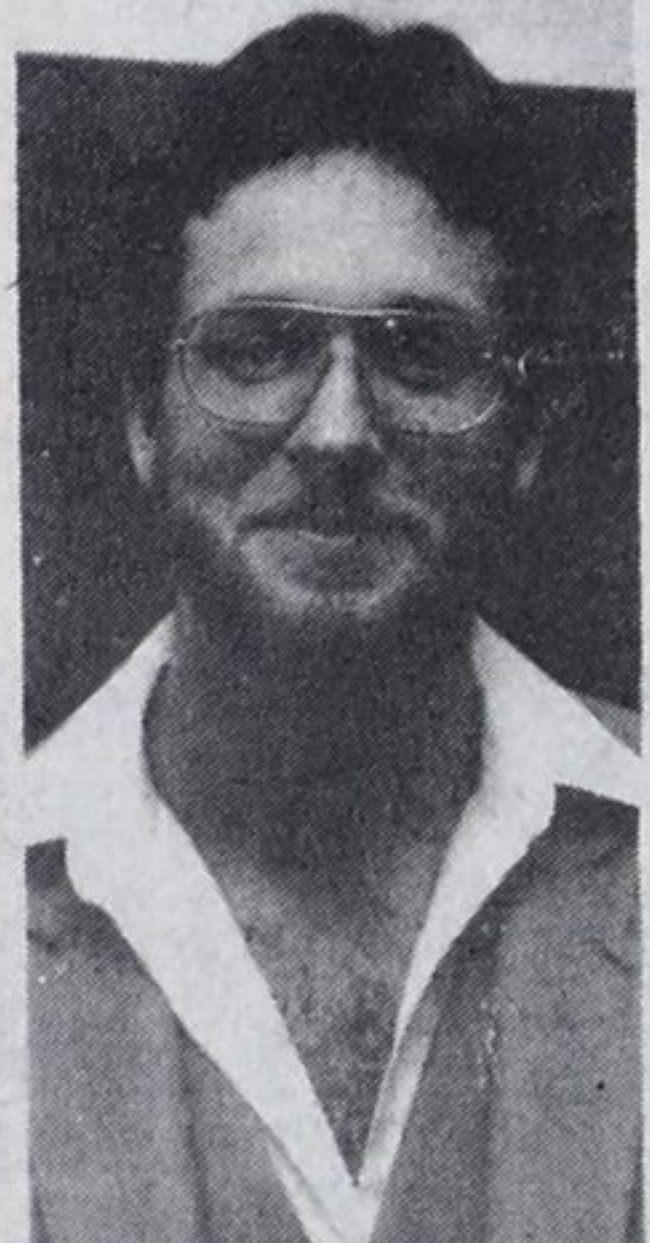
Also given the okay were 53 Grade Four students at the school who will travel to Camp Kitchikewana during that same period, June 1-5.

If you do not receive your questionnaires by June 1, or if you have any problems completing them, just call the Operator and ask for Zenith 0-1981.

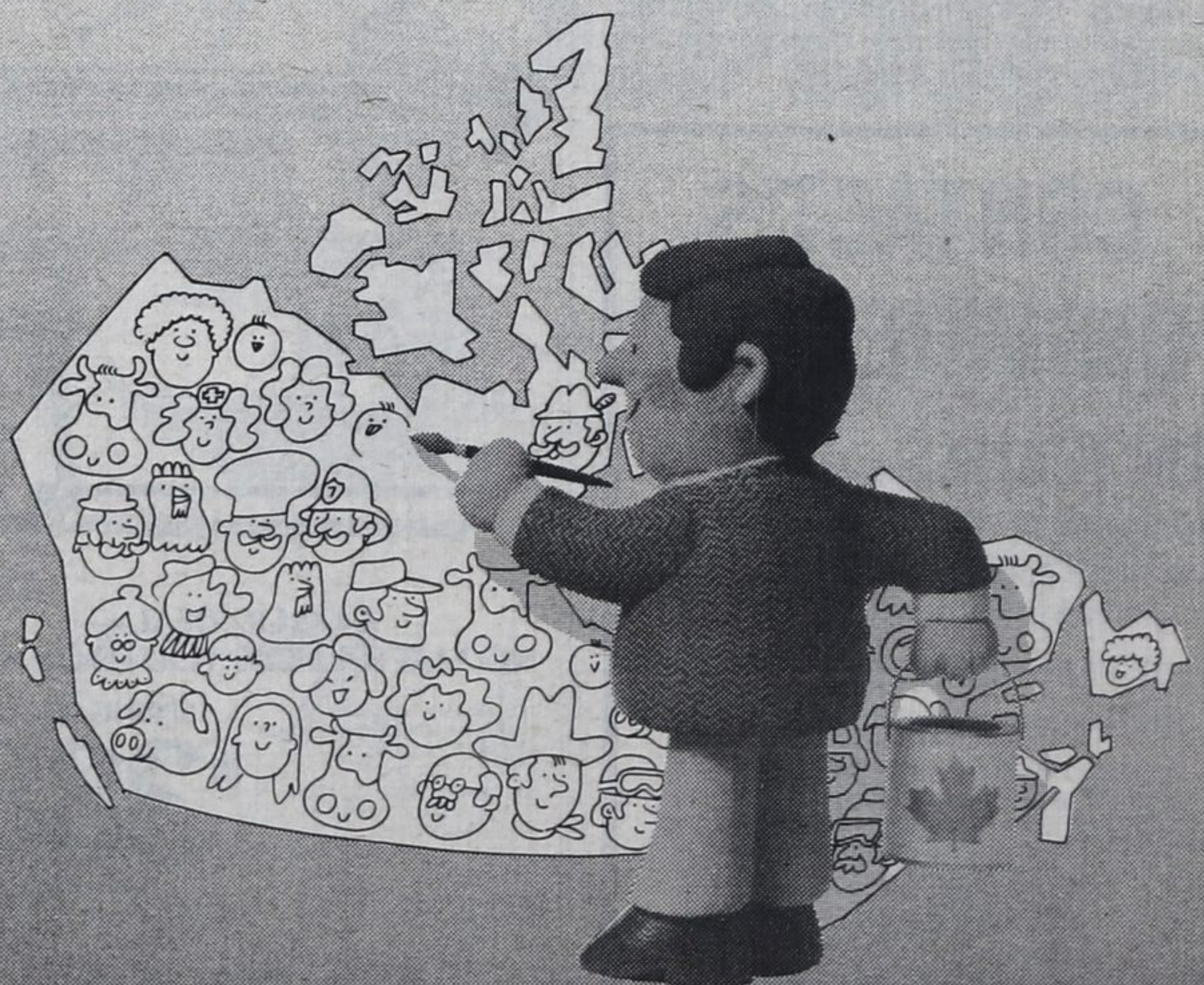
