Jason Perreault picked up a single assist for Midland in that game.

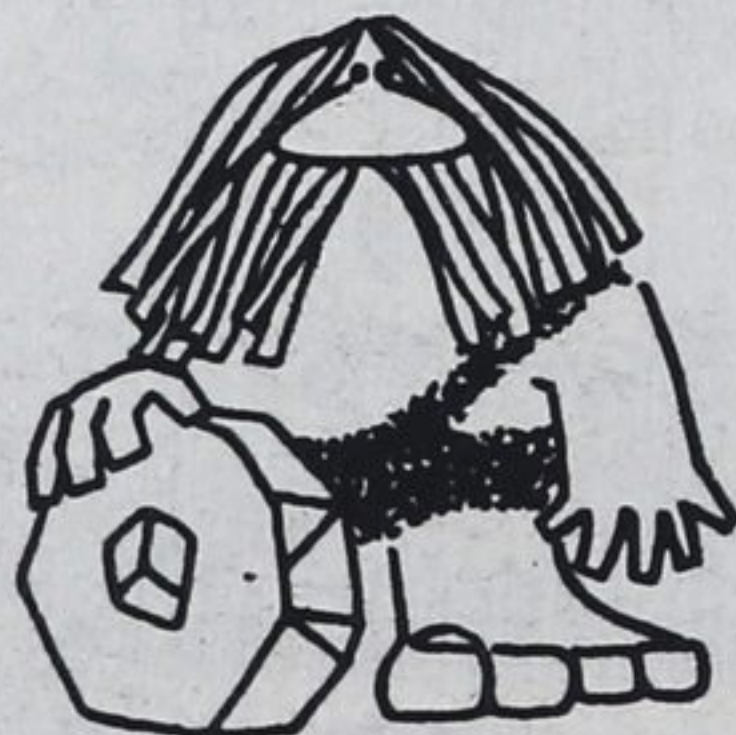
The next game for the A & W team will be tonight in Midland Centennial Arena when they will take on Gravenhurst at 7:30 p.m.

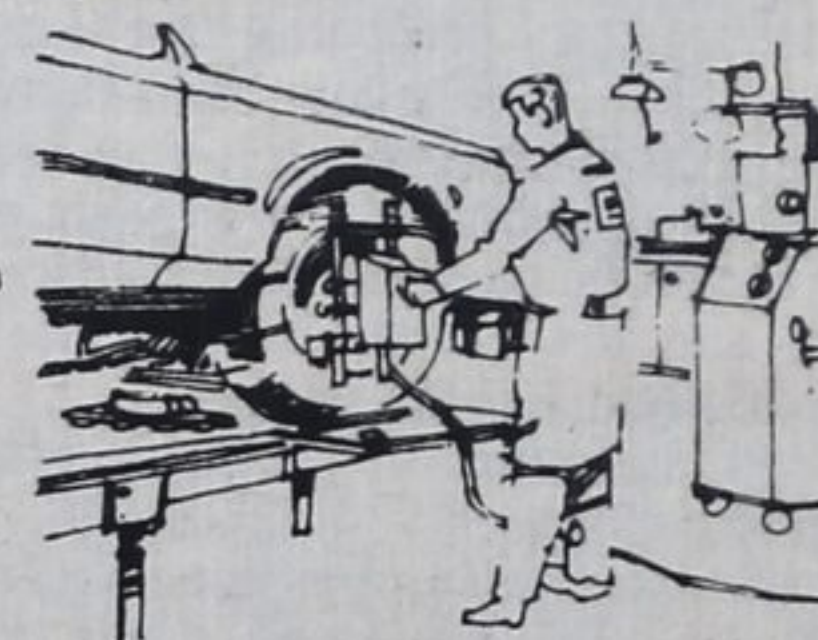
