A collection was taken up to help support the World Scout Brotherhood Fund. The Lord's Prayer was said by all.


Rev. Rod Barlow gave the final blessing. Our National Anthem "O Canada" was sung by all. The colours were then paraded out.

The value of the missing pop is \$9 but damage to the building committed during the break and entry was \$40.


Midland town police were informed of the break and enter last Saturday at 9.50 a.m.


