Because of the shortage of public pools in these areas the YMCA requires pools to be donated by the private sector.


This would involve using private pools for two hours daily, Monday through Friday for a period of two weeks.



Midland council this week approved buying a new 1981, 30-foot, 31 passenger Orion bus similar to this one tested out back in January in Midland. The bus will cost \$96,686 of which if the purchase is approved by the Ministry of Transportation and

Communications, the MTC will pay 75 per cent leaving the town to pick up \$24,171.50 of the overall cost. Midland's share will come from a \$50,000 reserve account for transit equipment.
