Soccer cheque

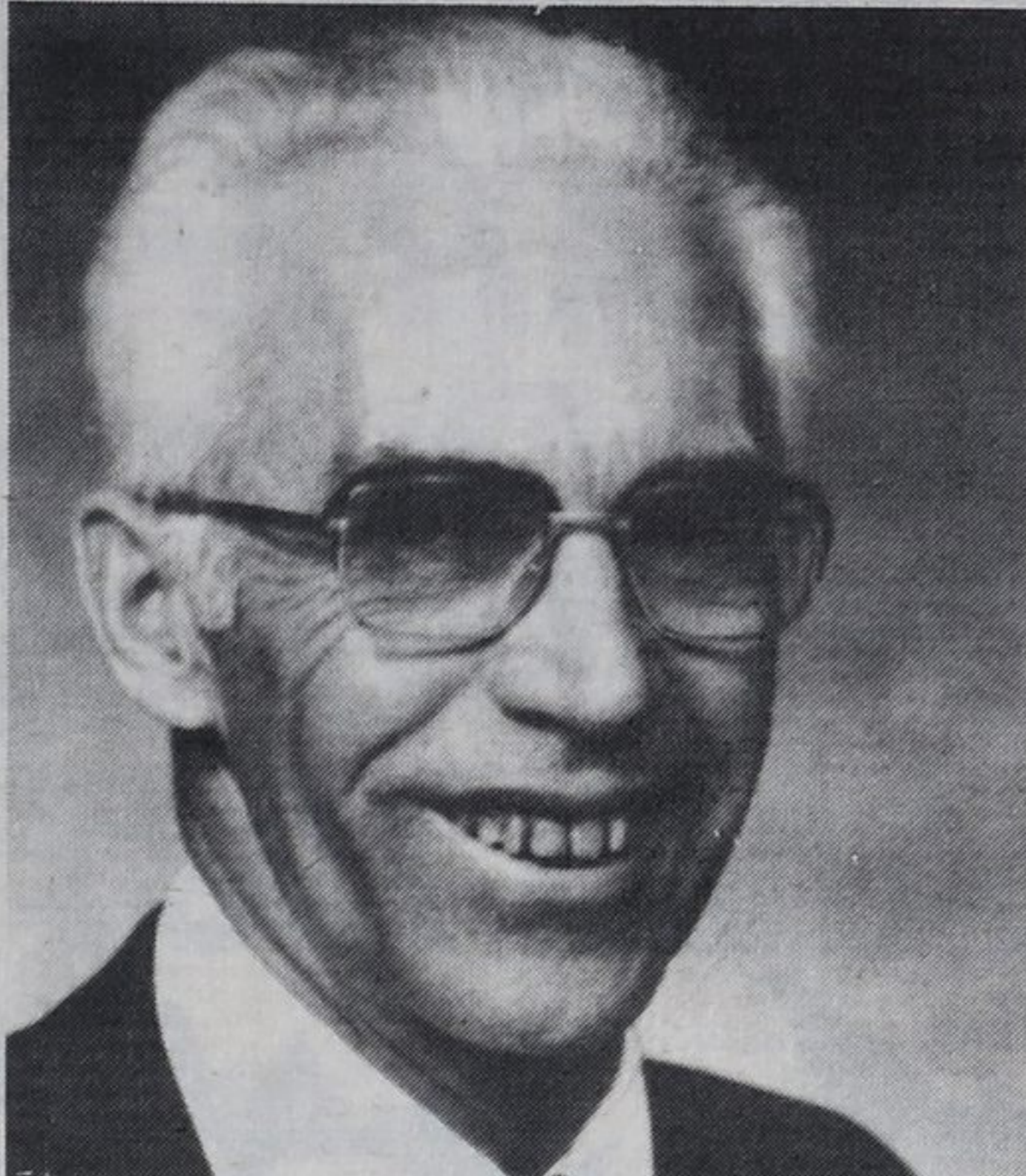
