Agreement reached between SCBE, bus companies

Agreement has been reached for a contract for 1981-82 between the 13 bus companies who carry students for the Simcoe County Board of Education, and the SCBE.

The increase in the cost of transportation to the board for 1981-82 will be 11 per cent.

The 11 per cent increase is predicted on the supposition that the same bus routes will be followed in 1981-82. If fewer buses are needed because of declining enrolment or other reasons, the cost to the board will be less, trustee Alvin Gravelle said yesterday.

Tooth decay prevention program approved

A program of fluoride mouthrinsing will be extended to all of the elementary schools falling under the Simcoe County Board of Education, starting in September.

The program has been running on a small scale in five elementary schools in the county.

The program has and will continue to be run by the Simcoe County District Health Unit, at no cost to the board of education.
