Platt noted, bargaining sessions have been exhausting while indicating he hoped there could be a settlement although he wouldn't predict when that could come about.



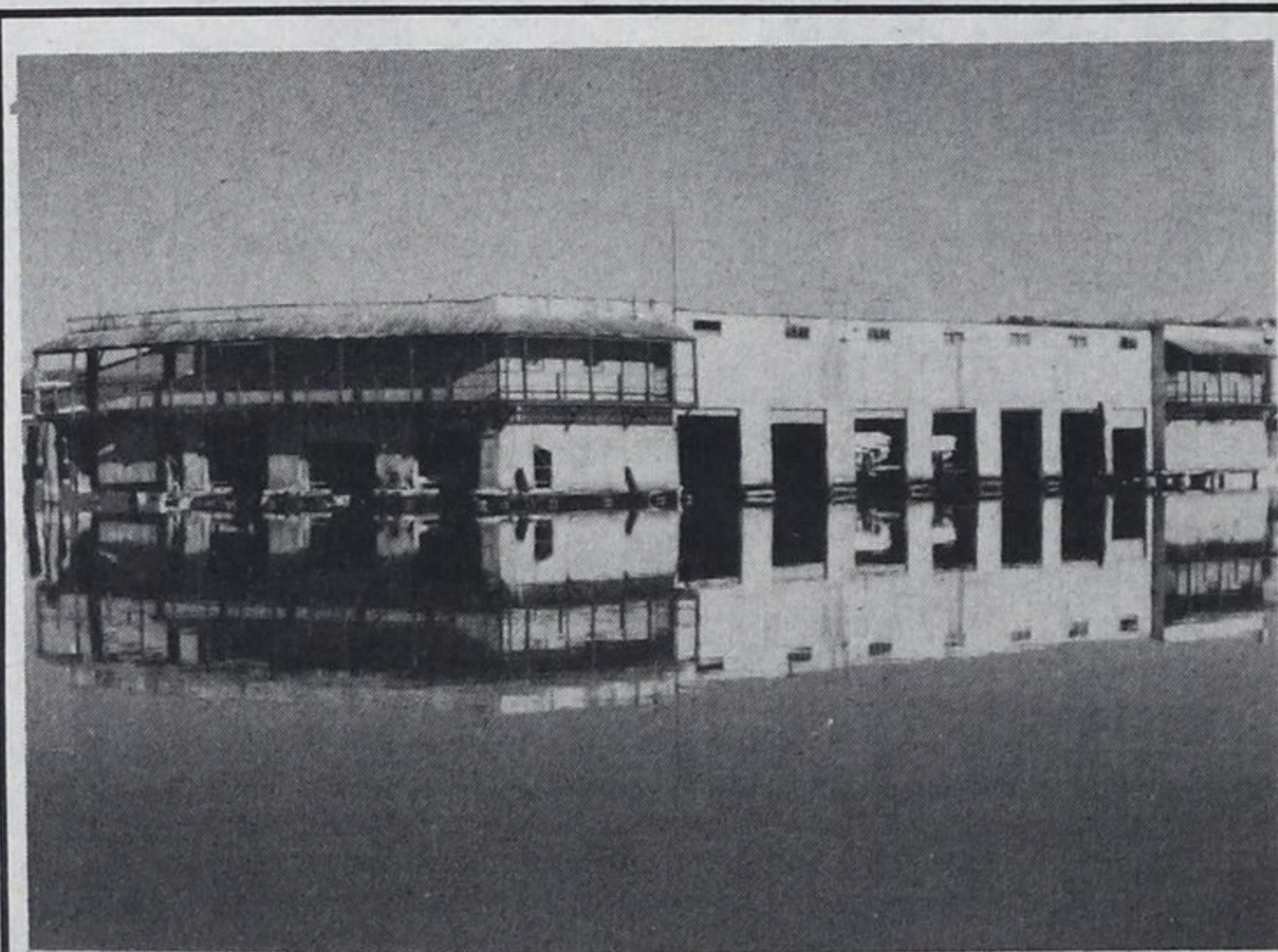

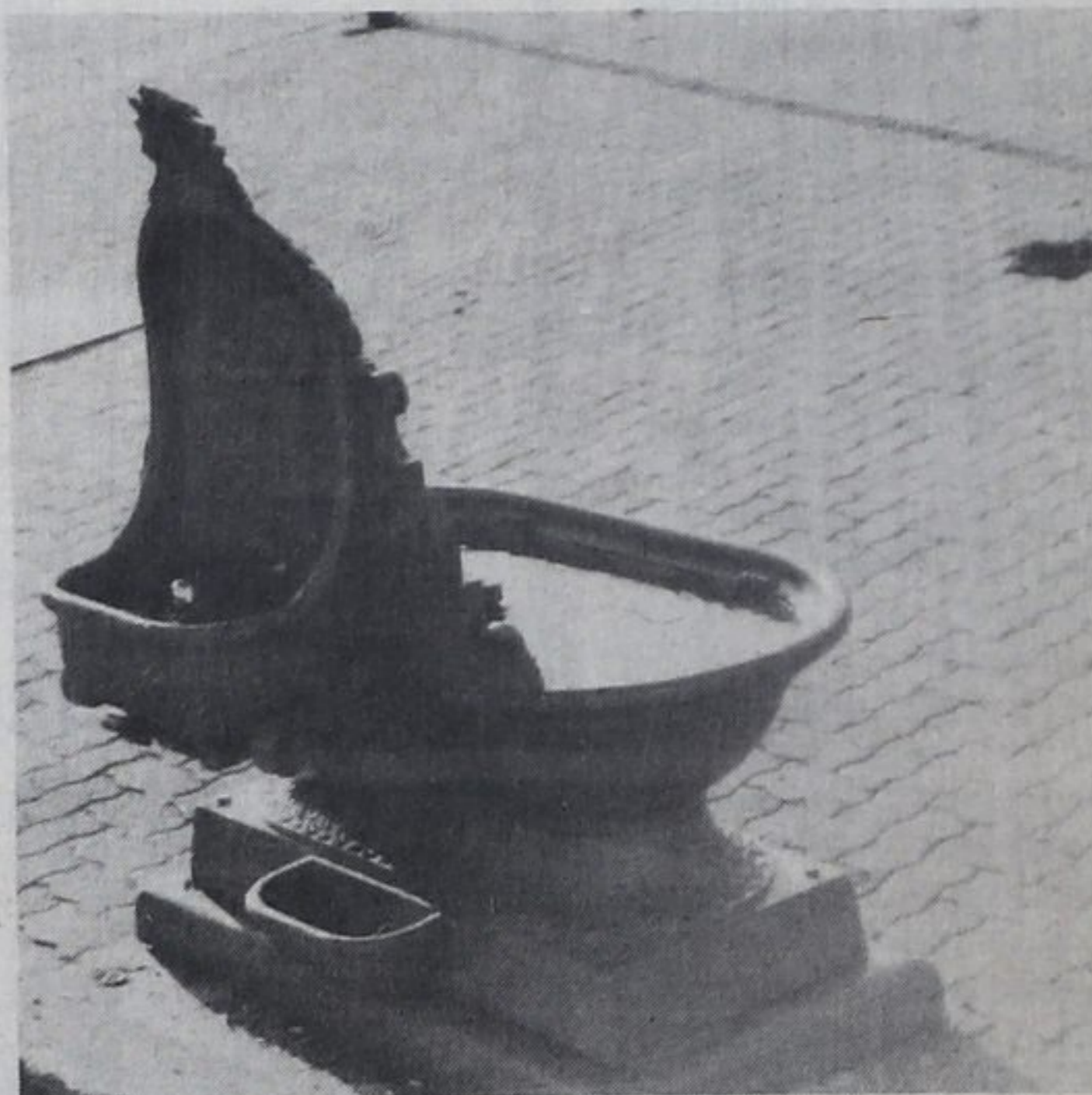
