The summer schedule for volleyball will continue August 22 when the Class A and B men's doubles will be held in conjunction with

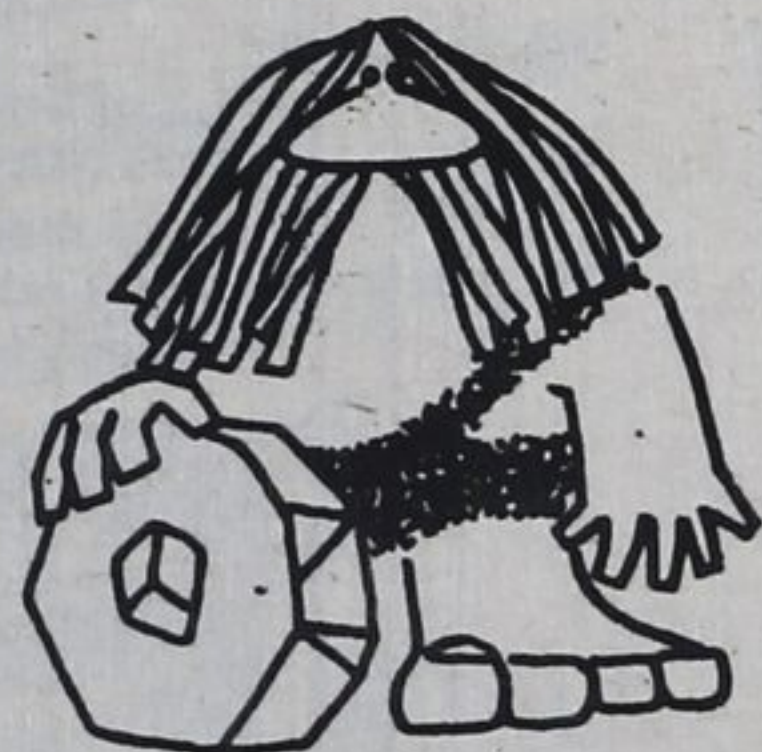
the Class A and B ladies Doubles Invitational. At present there are four courts in Little Lake Park and are for use by members of the public.
