Midland with 19. The Vasey Royals are six points behind at 13 in fourth place while Elmvale is in fifth with 12 points and Wyebridge has 11 points.

Perkinsfield sits in sixth place in the standings as of July 14 with a total of 10 points while Phelpston has 6 and Wyevalle has managed but one single point.
