Winning pitcher in the game was Laurie St. Amant with six walks while Sharon Borrow took the pitching duties for Midland with five walks.


Big hitters for Penetanguishene Branch 68 were C.King hitting four for five, J.Dusome, D.King,

Jesse Perrault fired a hat trick and a trio of



running up a two goal lead over the Midland team.


Midland redeemed themselves Wednesday night in a home game at Midland Secondary School as they edged out American Hotel of Barrie by a score of 1-0.
