Local athletes from the Adult Rehabilitation Centre in Midland and Huron Park School in Midland certainly made quite a showing at the Special Olympics this past week in Ottawa.

The provincial champion floor hockey squad from ARC is now the Canadian champion team, having won all their games played to bring home the gold medal.
