

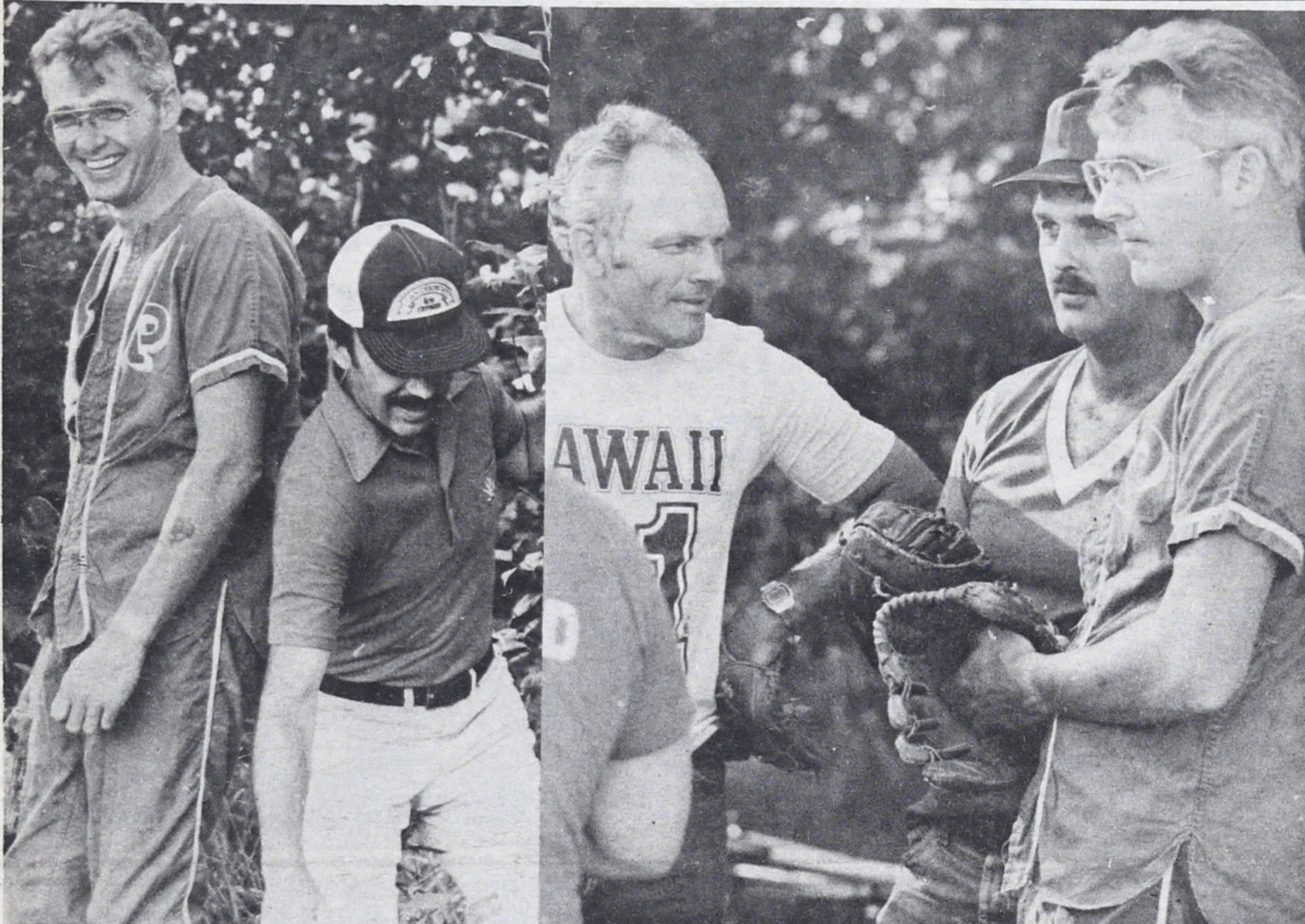

No details released

Progress reported on development freeze

Neither Mayor Ron Bellisle of Penetanguishene nor Reeve Morris Darby of Tiny Township would be specific about the details of the meeting held Tuesday to further discuss the development freeze in a section of Tiny Township, but the next day Mayor Bellisle said that the two sides were closer to an

agreement. Reeve Darby said that the meeting between a committee from Penetanguishene and representatives of Tiny Township in the Tiny Township municipal went well. The freeze on development put in place by the Ministry of Housing at Penetanguishene's request affects land in

Tiny Township beside Highway 27 between Midland and Penetanguishene. Tiny Township received a position paper from Penetanguishene a week ago. Tuesday evening proposals were made to Penetanguishene by Tiny Township that should be "quite acceptable," Reeve Darby

said. Mayor Bellisle said the Penetanguishene planning board and the town council will be considering the new proposals before a further meeting will be arranged with Tiny Township. Penetanguishene town council will be briefed on the substance of last Tuesday's meeting after the

monthly council meeting on Monday the mayor said. Contained in the position paper sent to Tiny Township was a reiteration of Penetanguishene's original position, that development along the highway through Tiny Township leading to Penetanguishene should be kept to appropriate highway development, and that Penetanguishene's downtown should be protected.

Tiny Township's official plan now allows for more types of development than that ordinarily allowed along highways, Mayor Bellisle said. Penetanguishene agrees with Tiny Township on some points, but it disagrees with the wording of some other points, wording that Tiny Township does not want to change, the mayor said.

Terry Cadeau, 26, of RR1, Penetanguishene, has been charged with possession of stolen property.

The wharfmaster Monday reported seeing a boat similar to the stolen boat, which belongs to Harry Friesman, of 20 Gignac Drive, Penetanguishene.
