holding tanks and chemical tanks are particularly dangerous. The Canada Safety Council warns that a number of rules must be followed while working in or around such areas.

- Good ventilation is essential. It is one of the best means of clearing an area of gases.

-Before entering confined spaces, consider a number of questions: Does a danger of toxic gas exist? Is there enough oxygen to support life? There might be a danger of explosion or of mechanical failure or faults.

-A self-contained breathing apparatus must be used for entry into liquid manure systems at all times and into the silo during the two to three weeks danger period after filling. Do not use a particle respirator.

-Confined spaces should never be entered unless a lifeline is attached to someone outside the area of danger. Always make sure another person is present before you enter a confined space.

-A number of toxic gases can be detected by special equipment. This equipment can be relatively expensive and some skill may be required to obtain accurate readings.
