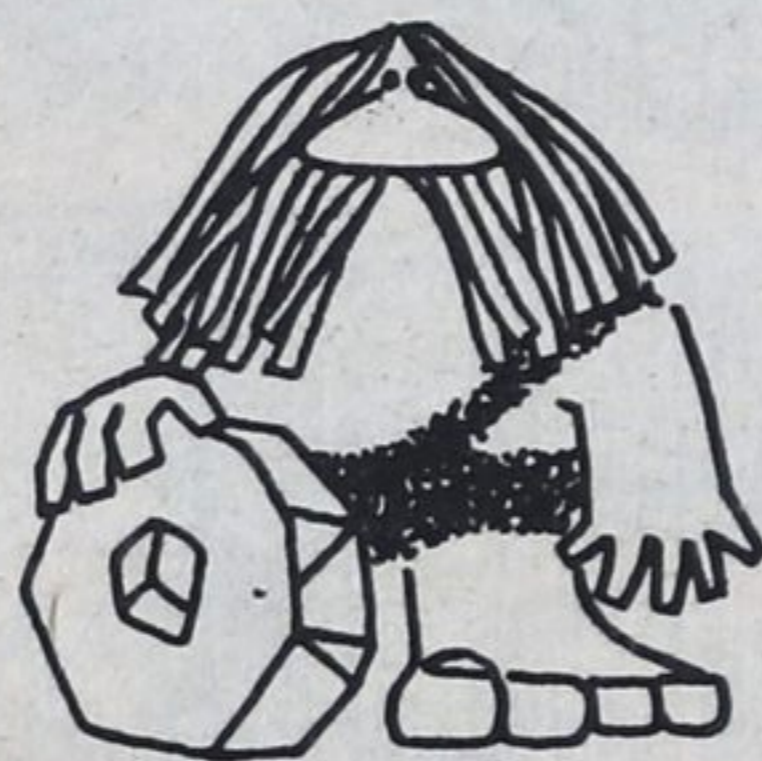

Canadian lacrosse championships

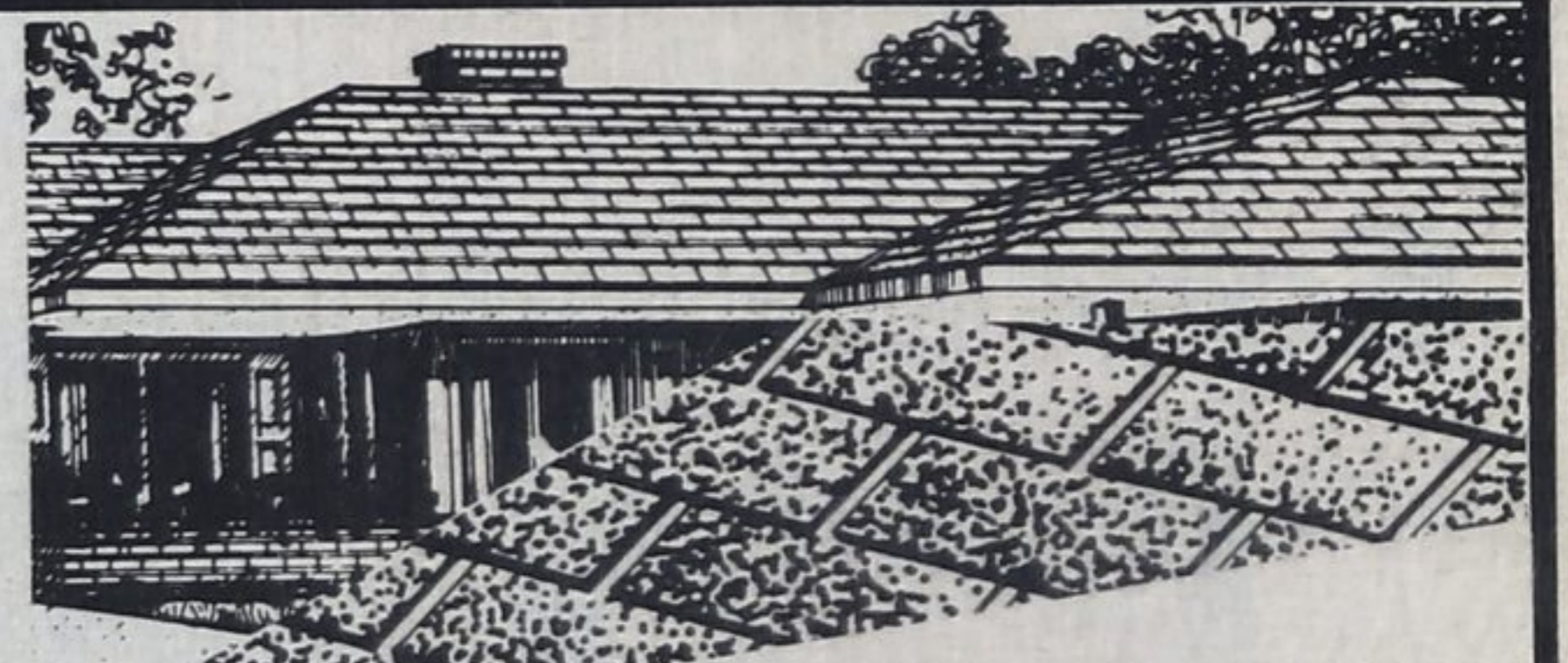
