

Fore! He's a jolly good fellow Jackson wins golf classic

Mike Jackson of Midland Golf and Country Club won the 30,000 Island Invitational Golf Tournament this past weekend with a gross score of 70 for 18 holes of golf.

This is the third year in a row Jackson has won that tournament.

The golfer with the best net score for 18 holes was Doug Hunt of Parry Sound Golf Course who shot a 64.

Longest drive was made by Rob Garner of Barrie and two golfers tied for being closest to the pin on the 16th hole, Ovi Lemesurier and Armand Desjardins, both of Midland Golf and Country Club.

This year, there were 184 golfers taking part, that figure topping last year's total of 168.

Despite the mail strike, the number of people who wanted to enter this tournament came to about 250 but the course will only accommodate 184 using tee-offs on the back and front nine holes at the same time.

For that reason, tournament organizer, Gord McLean feels that 184 golfers will be the largest number this tournament ever will allow.

This is McLean's last year as organizer and he deserves a hand for the work he has put into the tournament in the past years.
