Dear Sir:

We are a newly formed group of people called Citizens United for Safety and Justice who are concerned about the safety of children in our community.

There have recently been many attacks, rapes and murders of children in our province. It is our understanding that many known sex offenders are being released into communities across Canada without reasonable supervision of their day to day activities. Why?

Right now there is a law reform bill called Bill C53 before the House Commons which could provide revisions in our criminal laws. Mr. Jean-Guy DuBois is chairman of the Standing Committee of Justice and Legal Affairs charged with this review. We want to strongly encourage this committee to provide those revisions so that the ordinary citizen of Canada is better protected.

Our newly formed citizens group, of which the recently bereaved Clausen Family is an active supporter, appeals to you for help. We would like

every person who reads this letter to write a letter of their own to: Mr. Jean-Guy DuBois, Chairman.

Please take time to express your personal feelings and concerns regarding the obvious failure of the existing laws to protect us all.

Please forward your letter to CUSJ, Box 779, Duncan, B.C. V9L 3Y1 so that we may package and send them altogether to Mr. DuBois. Also, we will make and send copies of your letters to the Attorney General of British Columbia and the Solicitor General of Canada.

We are also seeking membership in this group at the rate of \$5.00 per person to cover printing and postage charges etc. A receipt will be issued. I have most of my family at home and am trying to feed and clothe them on \$150.00 per week U.I.C. benefits, but the real crusher came five days ago by registered mail when my mortgagee, C.A.C. Realty of Midland, advised me they are going to sell our house on the 23rd day of November, 1981 under "Notice of Sale Under Mortgage".

We have never asked for much and have never tried to live beyond our means. We know how to live very cheaply. At least we did when prices were on par with my earning power, but that is not the case any longer. I guess this is your governments' so called "DIRE STRAITS" personally I don't like it.

No doubt this rates only a laugh in your caucus meetings, but in our house it is viewed as a major destructive blow to our way of life.

I wish you and your colleagues would get your act together and start treating this country and its citizens more fairly, because if you keep on the way your going we won't have a country to bring the B.N.A. Act back to.

"Brother, can you spare a dime?", or maybe 230,000 dimes would be more in keeping with the requirements since it would then satisfy my mortgagee and I wouldn't have to bother you again.
