Reeve "Russ" Cooper of Rama Township has been elected Warden of Simcoe County for the coming year.

Warden Cooper was elected by a majority of County council Tuesday in Midhurst, defeating his rival candidate, Reeve Art Stewart of Penetanguishene.

Cooper had run unsuccessfully for Warden in 1980, but was elected Tuesday on what has become a traditional second attempt.

A procession of councillors was piped into the chambers at Midhurst for the annual roll-call vote at the 140th inaugural meeting of County council.

In the voting which ensued, a majority of the 40 County councillors including Midland representatives supported Rama Reeve Russ Cooper.

Art Stewart of Penetanguishene received the votes of Tiny and Tay delegates.

Some of the 40 County councillors cast more than one vote, according to the assessment of their municipality, bringing the total number of votes to 62.

M.P.P. Al McLean congratulated Warden Cooper on his election, and predicted that "we'll be seeing a Warden from Penetanguishene in the near future."
